A BILL

To amend Sections 211.10 and 211.20 of Am. Sub. 1
H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly and 2
Sections 207.230, 207.440, 223.10, and 223.40 of 3
H.B. 529 of the 132nd General Assembly to make 4
appropriations for the protection and 5
preservation of Lake Erie. 6

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Sections 211.10 and 211.20 of Am. Sub. 7
H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly be amended to read as 8
follows: 9

Sec. 211.20. SOIL AND WATER PHOSPHORUS PROGRAM 113

The Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the 114
Lake Erie Commission and the Ohio Soil and Water Conservation 115
Commission, shall establish rules outlining programs that comply 116
with Office of Budget and Management rules, as applicable, to 117
assist in reducing total phosphorus and dissolved reactive 118
phosphorus in the Western Lake Erie Basin. The programs shall 119
give priority to those subwatersheds determined to be highest in 120
total phosphorus and dissolved reactive phosphorus nutrient 121
loading. 122

The foregoing appropriation item 700417, Soil and Water 123
Phosphorus Program, shall be used to support the programs 124
described above which may include but not be limited to, the 125
following: (1) equipment for subsurface placement of nutrients 126
into the soil; (2) equipment for nutrient placement based on 127
geographic information system data; (3) soil testing; (4) 128
implementation of variable rate technology; (5) equipment 129
implementing manure transformation and manure conversion 130

technologies; (6) tributary monitoring; (7) water management and 131
edge-of-field drainage management; and (8) an agricultural 132
phosphorus reduction revolving loan program. 133

DANGEROUS AND RESTRICTED WILD ANIMALS 134

The foregoing appropriation item 700426, Dangerous and 135
Restricted Animals, shall be used to administer the Dangerous 136
and Restricted Wild Animal Permitting Program. 137

COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES 138

The foregoing appropriation item 700501, County 139
Agricultural Societies, shall be used to reimburse county and 140
independent agricultural societies for expenses related to 141
Junior Fair activities. 142

SUPPORT FOR SOIL AND WATER DISTRICTS IN THE WESTERN LAKE 143
ERIE BASIN 144

Of the foregoing appropriation item 700509, Soil and Water 145
District Support, \$350,000 in each fiscal year shall be used by 146
the Department of Agriculture for a program to support soil and 147
water conservation districts in the Western Lake Erie Basin in 148
complying with provisions of Sub. S.B. 1 of the 131st General 149
Assembly. The Department shall approve a soil and water 150
district's application for funding under the program if the 151
application demonstrates that funding will be used for, but not 152
limited to, providing technical assistance, developing 153
applicable nutrient or manure management plans, hiring and 154
training of soil and water conservation district staff on best 155
conservation practices, or other activities the Director 156
determines appropriate to assist farmers in the Western Lake 157
Erie Basin in complying with the provisions of Sub. S.B. 1 of 158
the 131st General Assembly. 159

Of the foregoing appropriation item 700509, Soil and Water District Support, \$3,500,000 in FY 2019 shall be used to support county soil and water conservation districts in the Western Lake Erie Basin for staffing costs and to assist in soil testing and nutrient management plan development, including manure transformation and manure conversion technologies, enhanced filter strips, water management, and other conservation support.

SOIL AND WATER DISTRICTS

In addition to state payments to soil and water conservation districts authorized by section 940.08 of the Revised Code, the Department of Agriculture may use appropriation item 700661, Soil and Water Districts, to pay any soil and water conservation district an annual amount not to exceed \$40,000 upon receipt of a request and justification from the district and approval by the Ohio Soil and Water Conservation Commission. The county auditor shall credit the payments to the special fund established under section 940.08 of the Revised Code for use by the local soil and water conservation district. The amounts received by each district shall be expended for the purposes of the district.

CLEAN OHIO AGRICULTURAL EASEMENT OPERATING EXPENSES

The foregoing appropriation item 700632, Clean Ohio Agricultural Easement Operating, shall be used by the Department of Agriculture in administering Ohio Agricultural Easement Fund (Fund 7057) projects pursuant to sections 901.21, 901.22, and 5301.67 to 5301.70 of the Revised Code.

Section 2. That existing Sections 211.10 and 211.20 of Am. Sub. H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly are hereby repealed.

Laboratory, shall be used by the Ohio Sea Grant Program to 242
construct new laboratory space at Stone Laboratory and purchase 243
new in-lake monitoring equipment, including real-time buoys and 244
water treatment plant monitoring sondes. 245

Sec. 207.440. The Ohio Public Facilities Commission is 246
hereby authorized to issue and sell, in accordance with Section 247
2n of Article VIII, Ohio Constitution, and Chapter 151. and 248
particularly sections 151.01 and 151.04 of the Revised Code, 249
original obligations in an aggregate principal amount not to 250
exceed ~~\$429,000,000~~\$431,000,000, in addition to the original 251
issuance of obligations heretofore authorized by prior acts of 252
the General Assembly. These authorized obligations shall be 253
issued, subject to applicable constitutional and statutory 254
limitations, as needed to provide sufficient moneys to the 255
credit of the Higher Education Improvement Fund (Fund 7034) and 256
the Higher Education Improvement Taxable Fund (Fund 7024) to pay 257
costs of capital facilities for state-supported and state- 258
assisted institutions of higher education. 259

that enhance efforts to reduce open lake disposal of dredged 312
materials into Lake Erie by 2020. 313

Sec. 223.40. The Ohio Public Facilities Commission is 314
hereby authorized to issue and sell, in accordance with Section 315
21 of Article VIII, Ohio Constitution, and Chapter 151. and 316
particularly sections 151.01 and 151.05 of the Revised Code, 317
original obligations in an aggregate principal amount not to 318
exceed ~~\$24,000,000~~ 34,000,000 in addition to the original 319
issuance of obligations heretofore authorized by prior acts of 320
the General Assembly. These authorized obligations shall be 321
issued, subject to applicable constitutional and statutory 322
limitations, as needed to provide sufficient moneys to the 323
credit of the Ohio Parks and Natural Resources Fund (Fund 7031) 324
to pay costs of capital facilities that enhance the use or 325
enjoyment of Ohio's natural resources. 326

Section 4. That existing Sections 207.230, 207.440, 327
223.10, and 223.40 of H.B. 529 of the 132nd General Assembly are 328
hereby repealed. 329
