This table summarizes the differences between L_132_1882-3 and L_132_1882-5, as the latter was subsequently amended by the committee through the adoption of AMs 1430, 1550, 1549X2, 1709, and 1741X1.

<p>Substance abuse grant programs <i>(R.C. 5119.63, 5119.64, and 5119.65)</i></p>	<p>Creates three grant programs to be administered by the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services to award grants to faith-based organizations that manage programs supporting individuals suffering from substance abuse and addiction.</p>	<p>Same, except:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> --Specifies that nonprofit community organizations also qualify for the grants; --Requires a grant applicant to include a "letter of input" from the board of alcohol, drug addiction, and mental health services (ADAMHS board) with jurisdiction over the applicant conveying the board's position on the applicant's perceived ability to successfully use the grant for its intended purpose. --Requires the Department to give the letter of input significant weight when making a final grant award determination.

<p>Drug overdose fatality review committees <i>(R.C. 121.22, 149.43, 307.631 to 307.639, 3701.049, and 4731.22)</i></p>	<p>No provision.</p>	<p>Authorizes the establishment of county or regional drug overdose review committees to decrease the incidence of preventable overdose deaths.</p> <p>Requires each committee to collect certain information concerning drug overdose or opioid-</p>

		<p>involved deaths, review the information, and submit annual reports to the Department of Health.</p> <p>Requires specified individuals or entities that provided services to a person whose death is reviewed by a committee to submit summary sheets of information to the committee.</p> <p>Grants immunity from civil liability to committee members and any individual or entity providing information to a committee.</p> <p>Provides that records presented to a review committee, statements made by committee members, committee work products, and data submitted to the Department of Health, other than annual reports, are confidential and not subject to disclosure under the public records law.</p> <p>Requires the Department of Health to adopt rules establishing procedures for a committee to follow in conducting reviews of overdose deaths.</p>
<p>Involuntary manslaughter involving a controlled substance <i>(R.C. 2903.04(A)(2) and (C))</i></p>	<p>Prohibits a person from recklessly causing the death of another or the unlawful termination of another's pregnancy as a result of the offender's sale of any controlled substance or controlled substance analog in violation of the existing crime of drug trafficking.</p>	<p>No provision.</p>

<p>Naloxone administration reports</p> <p><i>(R.C. 3727.81, 4765.60, and 4765.61)</i></p>	<p>Requires a hospital or inpatient drug treatment facility in which naloxone was administered to an individual, as well as an emergency medical services person or peace officer who administered naloxone, to notify a DART or QRT if one exists in the relevant community.</p> <p>Requires hospitals and inpatient drug treatment facilities, as well as EMS personnel and peace officers, to submit monthly reports to the State Board of Emergency Medical, Fire, and Transportation Services regarding each individual to whom naloxone was administered in the preceding calendar month.</p>	<p>No provision.</p> <p>No provision.</p>
<p>Income tax deduction for uncompensated medical services</p> <p><i>(R.C. 5747.01(A)(33) and 5747.014)</i></p>	<p>Authorizes a personal income tax deduction for a physician based on the number of hours the physician provides uncompensated medical services through a hospital, free clinic, or nongovernmental medical organization.</p>	<p>No provision.</p>
