The purpose of this letter is to compel the Ohio House of Representatives to consider passing legislation to provide exceptions that will allow Fallen Hero Families and Veterans, especially Combat Injured Veterans special access and use of our Ohio State Parks and Facilities for providing fun and healing outdoor adventures, preferable at no charge.

Our small non-profit has facilitated outdoor experiences in Ohio for well over 100 combat injured warriors and fallen hero families, and we have found outdoor experiences to be tremendously helpful in created an environment for bonding and healing happen, and grief is put in the past.

Every year we include night bow fishing adventures as part of our Warrior Weekend to Remember. We have found that these experiences directly and positively impact PTSD and we would expect it reduces veteran suicide rates. Of course, we have not hard evidence to show that someone did or did not commit suicide because of the adventures we provide, but we do know that our Warrior Weekend to Remember puts a smile on their faces and grows their support network.
