

Insurance Committee Chairman Tom Brinkman, Jr. May 23, 2018

Chairman Brinkman called the House Insurance Committee to order at 10:06 AM. A quorum was present. The minutes were approved.

House Bill 621, Rep. Hughes, 1st hearing, sponsor testimony

• Rep. Hughes provided sponsor testimony. Questions were asked.

House Bill 367, Rep. DeVitis, 3rd hearing, all testimony (opponent/proponent/interested party)

- Erika Cybulskis and Dr. Jeffrey Johnson, Delta Dental Ohio, provided opponent testimony. Questions were asked.
- Sean Mentel, America's Health Insurance Plans, provided opponent testimony. Questions were asked.

- Vice Chair Henne made a motion to favorably report HB 367 out of committee. Rep. Retherford seconded. With a 5-5 vote, the motion did not pass.

House Bill 459, Rep. Henne, 3rd hearing, opponent

- John VanDoorn, Ohio Association for Justice, provided written opponent testimony.
- Robert Brundrett provided written opponent testimony. This testimony was a joint group testimony from Ohio Chamber of Commerce, Ohio Manufacturer's Association, Ohio Council of Retail Merchants, and the Ohio Self-Insurer's Association.

Rep. Gonzales made a motion to favorably pass HB 367 out of committee. Rep. Retherford seconded. Rep. Boccieri objected to the motion citing House Rule 41 which states that members have to have first been present and recorded as such before a vote is taken. The Chair ruled that because Rep. Gonzales' motion to favorably report HB 367 was a new motion and not a motion to reconsider, members would be eligible to vote on the new motion without having been present

for the earlier motion made by Rep. Henne. The roll was called. The bill favorably passed out of committee with a vote of 7-4. The roll was left open until 12 PM
