**Referral Report**

**February 28, 2017**

Representative Celebrezze reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills, House Joint Resolution, and Senate Bill be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

**H. B. No. 71 – Representative DeVitis**

To specify that failure to display a license plate on the front of a motor vehicle that is required to display a front license plate is a secondary traffic offense and to establish a maximum fine of \$100 for such an offense.

**To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety**

**H. B. No. 72 – Representatives Johnson, T., Antonio**

To adopt requirements related to step therapy protocols implemented by health plan issuers and the Department of Medicaid.

**To the committee on Health**

**H. B. No. 73 – Representatives Rezabek, Koehler**

To prohibit sales of dextromethorphan without a prescription to persons under age 18.

**To the committee on Health**

**H. B. No. 74 – Representatives Huffman, Gavarone**

To increase the maximum income tax deduction for contributions to the state's 529 college savings program from \$2,000 to \$3,000 per beneficiary per year.

**To the committee on Ways and Means**

**H. B. No. 75 – Representatives Gavarone, Merrin**

To establish an expedited process to grant a professional license to an individual who is on active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United States, or is the spouse of such an individual, and holds a valid license in another state.

**H. B. No. 76 – Representatives Arndt, Gavarone**

To create the “Ohio National Guard Ohio Cross” license plate and the “Ottawa National Wildlife Refuge” license plate.

**H. B. No. 77 – Representative Retherford**

To provide for the licensure of sick-child care centers.

**To the committee on Economic Development, Commerce, and Labor**

**H. B. No. 78 – Representative Retherford**

To revise the laws governing the provision of adult protective services.

**To the committee on Aging and Long Term Care**

**H. B. No. 79 – Representatives Retherford, Hagan**

To provide for firearms training for tactical medical professionals; to permit such a professional who has received that training and has been authorized by the law enforcement agency to carry firearms while on duty; and to grant such a professional the same right to carry a concealed handgun in this state as a concealed handgun licensee.

**To the committee on Federalism and Interstate Relations**

**H. B. No. 80 – Representatives LaTourette, Smith, K.**

To require school districts to allow approved summer food service program sponsors to use school facilities to provide food service for summer intervention services under certain conditions.

**To the committee on Education and Career Readiness**

**H. B. No. 81 – Representatives Seitz, Antonio**

To provide that a person convicted of aggravated murder who shows that the person had a serious mental illness at the time of committing the offense cannot be sentenced to death for the offense and to provide a mechanism for resentencing to a life sentence a person previously sentenced to death who proves that the person had a serious mental illness at the time of committing the offense.

**H. B. No. 82 – Representative Ryan**

To adjust the fees allowed to county treasurers for collecting property taxes.

**H. B. No. 83 – Representatives Smith, K., Howse**

To designate the planned boulevard known as the Opportunity Corridor within Cleveland as the “Carl and Louis Stokes Opportunity Corridor.”

Regarding public moneys returned to the state as a result of a finding for recovery issued pursuant to an audit of a community school.

## **Sub. S. B. No. 25 – Senator Hottinger**

To create the Perry County Municipal Court in New Lexington on January 1, 2018, to establish one full-time judgeship in that court, to provide for the nomination of the judge by petition only, to abolish the Perry County County Court on that date, to designate the Perry County Clerk of Courts as the clerk of the Perry County Municipal Court, to provide for the election for the Perry County Municipal Court of one full-time judge in 2017, to modify the provisions regarding the membership of the Criminal Justice Recodification Committee, and to declare an emergency.
