**Referral Report**

**May 9, 2017**

Representative \_\_\_\_\_ reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills and Senate Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

**H. B. No. 192 – Representatives Miller, Anielski**

To permit county veterans service commissions to elect to add two members to the commission, one who is a veteran who served in Operation Enduring Freedom or Operation Iraqi Freedom, or subsequently in those theaters of operation, and one who is a military spouse.

**To the committee on Armed Services, Veterans Affairs, and Homeland Security**

**H. B. No. 193 – Representative Hagan**

To prohibit an employer from taking an adverse employment action against a person who has not been or will not be vaccinated against influenza.

**To the committee on Economic Development, Commerce, and Labor**

**H. B. No. 194 – Representatives Johnson, Craig**

To establish a program for the issuance of special license plates related to military service and awards.

**To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety**

**H. B. No. 195 – Representatives Ingram, Seitz**

To modify the provisions concerning the transport of persons who require the use of a wheelchair or other mobility aid in nonemergency circumstances.

**H. B. No. 196 – Representative Lipps**

To designate October as “Ohio Chiropractic Awareness Month.”

**To the committee on Health**

**H. B. No. 197 – Representative Patton**

To provide for insurance reimbursement for EMT services in nonemergency situations.

**H. B. No. 198 – Representative Koehler**

To prohibit a lottery sales agent from accepting a credit card for the purchase of a lottery ticket.

**To the committee on Government Accountability and Oversight**

**H. B. No. 199 – Representative Blessing**

To create the Ohio Residential Mortgage Lending Act for the purpose of regulating all non-depository lending secured by residential real estate and to limit the application of the current Mortgage Loan Law to unsecured loans and loans secured by other than residential real estate.

**To the committee on Financial Institutions, Housing, and Urban Development**

**H. B. No. 200 – Representative Koehler**

To eliminate the Educational Choice Scholarship Pilot Program and Pilot Project Scholarship Program and to create the Opportunity Scholarship Program.

**To the committee on Education and Career Readiness**

**H. B. No. 201 – Representatives Hood, Brinkman**

To allow a concealed handgun licensee to carry concealed all firearms other than dangerous ordnance or firearms prohibited by state or federal law; to repeal the requirement that a licensee stopped for a law enforcement purpose promptly inform an approaching officer if the licensee is carrying a firearm and provide for expungement of convictions based on a violation of the requirement; and to provide that a person age 21 or older and not prohibited by federal law from possessing or receiving a firearm does not need a concealed handgun license in order to carry a concealed firearm and is subject to the same laws regarding concealed firearm carrying as a licensee.

**To the committee on Federalism and Interstate Relations**

**H. B. No. 202 – Representative Thompson**

To designate the first Saturday of May as “Veterans Suicide Awareness Day.”

**To the committee on Armed Services, Veterans Affairs, and Homeland Security**

**Am. Sub. S. B. No. 1 – Senator LaRose**

To increase penalties for drug trafficking violations, drug possession violations, and aggravated funding of drug trafficking when the drug involved in the offense is a fentanyl-related compound, except for drug possession violations when the fentanyl-related compound is combined with marijuana or a Schedule III, IV, or V controlled substance and the total amount of the combination drug is less than 40 unit doses or 4 grams and the offender did not know of the fentanyl content; to revise the manner of determining sentence for certain violations of the offense of permitting drug abuse; and to add lisdexamfetamine to the list of schedule II controlled substances.

**Sub. S. B. No. 3 – Senators Beagle, Balderson**

To revise the laws governing the state's workforce development system, programs that may be offered by primary and secondary schools, certificates of qualification for employment, and the Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities Agency, and to designate the first week of May as In-Demand Jobs Week.

**To the committee on Higher Education and Workforce Development**

**S. B. No. 6 – Senator Hoagland**

To extend the Ohio Bridge Partnership Program through the end of fiscal year 2019 and to require the Director of Transportation to submit a report to the Governor, Senate, and House of Representatives recommending ways to continue to fund the program.

**To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety**

**Sub. S. B. No. 20 – Senator Hackett**

To require an additional prison term of 3 to 8 years for an offender who is convicted in specified circumstances of a felony offense of endangering children or felonious assault of a child if the offender also is convicted of a specification that the victim suffered permanent disabling harm and to name the act "Destiny's Law."

**To the committee on Criminal Justice**

**Am. S. B. No. 33 – Senator Eklund**

To allow disclosure of information from the law enforcement automated data system (LEADS) to a defendant in a traffic or criminal case.

**To the committee on Criminal Justice**

**S. B. No. 37 – Senator Hite**

To require the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission to develop and conduct a chief of police training course for newly appointed village, city, and township chiefs of police.

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**S. B. No. 88 – Senator Terhar**

To modify the composition and powers of the financial planning and supervision commission of a political subdivision that is in a state of fiscal emergency and to clarify the duties of that political subdivision.

**To the committee on Government Accountability and Oversight**
