Referral Report

February 20, 2018

Representative Sykes reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills and Senate Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

H. B. No. 497 – Representatives Rogers, Manning

To prohibit the nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images, to require that certain property involved in the offense be criminally forfeited, and to create certain legal rights and employment protections of a victim of the offense.

To classify resisting arrest as an offense of violence and to increase the penalties for certain resisting arrest offenses.
