**Referral Report**

**March 6, 2018**

Representative Celebrezze reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills and Senate Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

**H. B. No. 526 – Representatives DeVitis, Sweeney**

To authorize a public or chartered nonpublic school to enter into an agreement with a volunteer law enforcement officer to patrol school premises to prevent or respond to a mass casualty event, to provide the parties with a qualified immunity from civil liability, and to provide a tax credit for volunteer service.

**To the committee on Education and Career Readiness**

**H. B. No. 527 – Representative LaTourette**

To allow certain specified persons to petition the probate court for reasonable visitation with an incompetent or ward if visitation between the person and the incompetent or ward has been interfered with or denied.

**To the committee on Aging and Long Term Care**

**H. B. No. 528 – Representatives Smith, R., Rezabek**

To expand the penalties for abuse of corpse offenses.

**To the committee on Criminal Justice**

**H. B. No. 530 – Representatives Hambley, Arndt**

To authorize local elected officers that have levied a hotel lodging excise tax, or a designee of such officers to simultaneously hold the position of officer or member of the board of trustees of a convention and visitors' bureau without constituting incompatible offices.

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**H. B. No. 531 – Representatives Schuring, Greenspan**

To remove limitations on the amount of sports events grants that may be awarded in a fiscal year or for a specific grant, and to fund the grant program by diverting state sales tax receipts to a custodial fund administered by the Director of Development Services.

**To the committee on Government Accountability and Oversight**

**H. B. No. 532 – Representatives Galonski, Fedor**

To require all state officials and employees and all employees of state contractors and vendors to complete training on the prevention and elimination of sexual harassment and to establish a Commission on Sexual Harassment within the office of the Attorney General to study and make recommendations to eliminate workplace sexual harassment.

**H. B. No. 533 – Representative Pelanda**

Regarding foster caregiver training and foster home assessor requirements.

**To the committee on Community and Family Advancement**

**H. B. No. 534 – Representative Retherford**

To designate a portion of State Route 4 in Butler County as the "Firefighter and Paramedic Patrick Wolterman Memorial Highway."

**To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety**

**H. B. No. 535 – Representative Gavarone**

To require certain reports regarding overdoses and naloxone, to include naltrexone within the Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System, and to name this act the "Opioid Data and Communication Expansion Act."

**To the committee on Community and Family Advancement**

**H. B. No. 536 – Representative Reece**

To prohibit health plan issuers, including those participating in the Medicaid care management system, from implementing any form of selective emergency services coverage.

**To the committee on Insurance**

**Am. S. B. No. 21 – Senator Uecker**

To reduce the minimum number of precinct election officials in a precinct in which electronic pollbooks are used.

**To the committee on Government Accountability and Oversight**

**Sub. S. B. No. 66 – Senators Eklund, Tavares**

To modify criminal sentencing and corrections law by including the promotion of effective rehabilitation as a purpose of felony sentencing, removing the one-year minimum for presumptive fourth or fifth degree felony community control sanctions, modifying sanctions for a violation of a community control condition, modifying the manner of calculating confinement credits, modifying eligibility criteria and procedures for granting intervention in lieu of conviction, making offenders convicted of certain multiple fourth or fifth degree felonies eligible for conviction record sealing, revising procedures for the Adult Parole Authority to grant a final release or terminate post-release control, and modifying the criteria for considering a prison term sanction for a post-release control violation; to extend the State Highway Patrol's authority to enforce criminal laws to also apply to the Northeast Ohio Correctional Center; and to modify the penalty for an employer's failure to remit state income taxes withheld from an employee.
