Rules Report

The House Rules and Reference committee met on Tuesday, April 10, 2018, at 12:30 p.m.

The following matters, being properly before the committee and pursuant to House Rule 66, were scheduled for third consideration on the House calendar in the order indicated below for the date indicated below.

Wednesday, April 11, 2018

Sub. H. B. No. 360 Greenspan, et al. – To enact the "Ohio Anti-Bullying and Hazing Act" with regard to school discipline and bullying and hazing policies at public schools and colleges.

Sub. H. B. No. 378 Smith, R., Cera, et al. – To create the Ohio Broadband Development Grant Program, to encourage the Department of Transportation to work with telecommunications providers to lay fiber optic cable, and to make an appropriation.

Sub. H. B. No. 263 Lanese, et al. – To authorize a food service operation or retail food establishment to allow a person to bring a dog in an outdoor dining area of the establishment or operation under specified conditions.

Sub. H. B. No. 131 Gavarone, Reineke, et al. – To modify the laws governing the practice of physical therapy.

Sub. H. B. No. 508 Ryan, Reineke, et al. – To establish the OhioCorps Pilot Project and to make an appropriation.

Sub. H. B. No. 489 Dever – To provide some regulatory and tax relief to state banks and credit unions, to provide for data analytics to be conducted on publicly available information regarding banks, credit unions, and consumer finance companies, to require registration of mortgage loan servicers, and to require a specified notice be given to a debtor for certain debt collection.

Sub. H. B. No. 318 Patterson, LaTourette, et al. – With regard to school resource officers, to require the Facilities Construction Commission to study and report on school building security upgrades, and to make an appropriation.

H. B. No. 135 Patmon – To designate June 12th as "Superman Day."
