Rules Report

The House Rules and Reference committee met on Tuesday, December 4, 2018, at 12:15 p.m.

The following matters, being properly before the committee and pursuant to House Rule 66, were scheduled for third consideration on the House calendar in the order indicated below for the date indicated below.

Wednesday, December 5, 2018

H. C. R. No. 24 Riedel, Holmes, et al. – To urge Congress to propose the Regulation Freedom Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

H. C. R. No. 20 Schaffer, et al. – To urge Congress to encourage the Administrator of the FMCSA to change the crash indicator BASIC regulation standards to consider only crashes in which the driver was at fault for the crash.

Sub. H. B. No. 545 Arndt, et al. – To authorize small retailers to remit sales taxes when the retailer receives payment from the purchaser if the payment is received after the purchased item is delivered or the service is provided and to exempt from sales and use tax tampons and other feminine hygiene products associated with menstruation.

H. B. No. 705 Hambley, Ingram, et al. – Regarding the circumstances in which school district and educational service center treasurers may be held liable for a loss of public funds.

H. B. No. 710 Johnson, et al. – To add "high-mobility multipurpose wheeled vehicle manufactured for military purposes" to the definition of "historical motor vehicle."

H. B. No. 721 Riedel, et al. – To designate the week that includes July 20th as "One Small Step Week."

Sub. S. B. No. 231 Gardner, et al. – To provide for a violent offender database, establish a presumption that violent offenders must enroll in the database for ten years, establish procedures for a violent offender to rebut the presumption and avoid the duty and procedures for court extension of the duty and termination of an extended duty, and name those provisions of the act "Sierah's Law;" to modify the membership and duties of the Ex-Offender Reentry Coalition and eliminate its repeal; to require halfway

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houses to use the single validated risk assessment tool for adult offenders that the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction has developed; and to provide that the notice of release from prison of specified serious offense offenders that is given to sheriffs is to be the same as that provided to prosecuting attorneys and eliminate the notice to sheriffs regarding pardons, commutations, paroles, and transitional control transfers of offenders.

S. C. R. No. 23 Obhof, Peterson, et al. – To reassert the principles of federalism found throughout the Constitution of the United States of America and embodied in the Tenth Amendment, to notify Congress to limit and end certain mandates, and to insist that federal legislation contravening the Tenth Amendment be prohibited or repealed.
