# Local Sanitarian Evaluations 2016 Annual Report

House Bill 65 requires the Directors of Agriculture and Health to produce an annual report identifying the violations most commonly missed by registered sanitarians and sanitarians-in-training.

The attached report includes the list of most commonly missed critical and non-critical violations. It also includes a breakdown of 2016 evaluations by local health district.

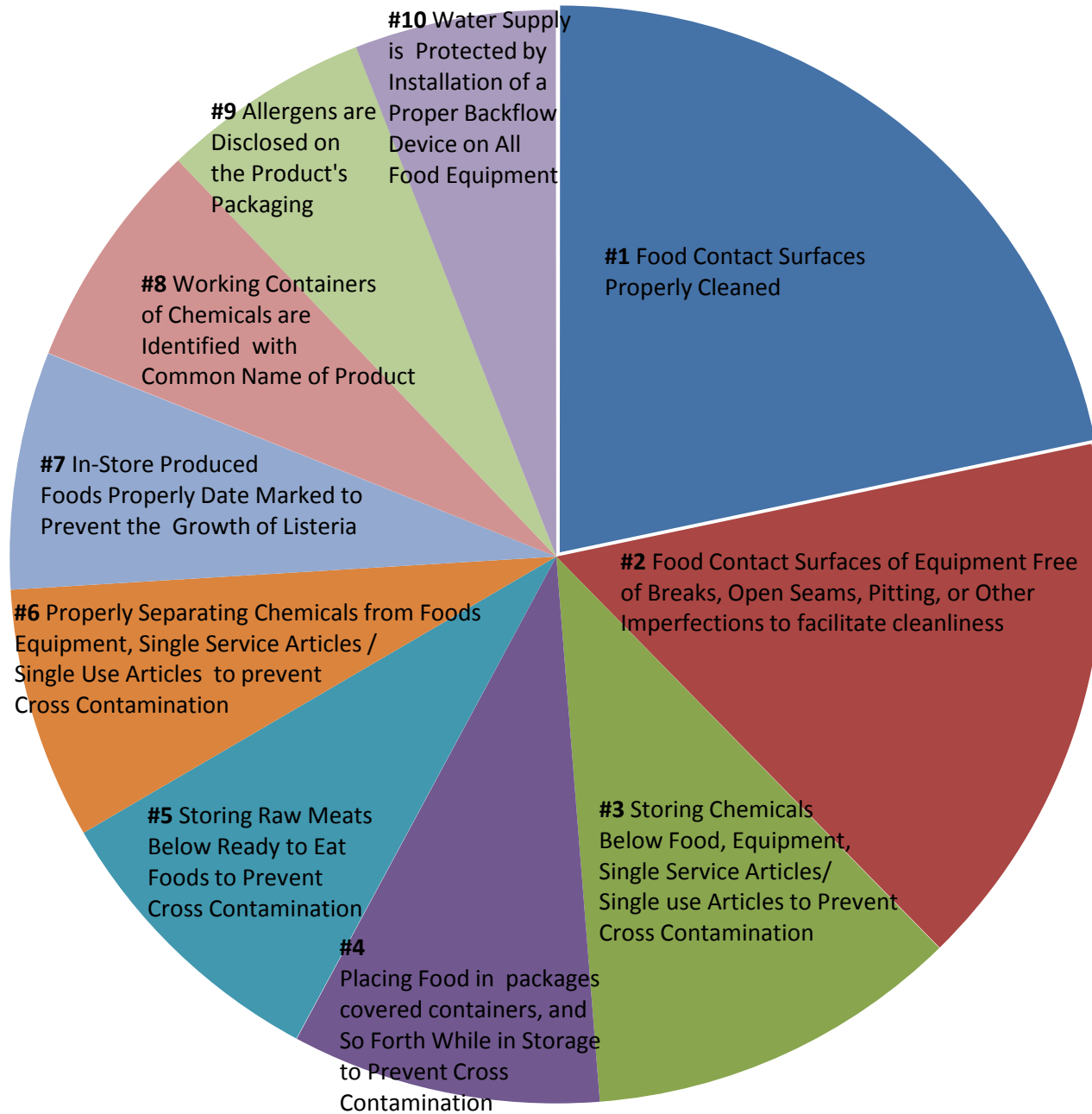
**Top Ten Critical Violations Missed by LHD sanitarians**

<b>Rank</b>	<b>Description</b>	<b>Frequency</b>
1	Food contact surfaces properly cleaned	102
2	Food contact surfaces of equipment free of breaks, open seams, pitting, or other imperfections to maintain cleanliness	75
3	Storing chemicals below food, equipment, single service articles/ single use articles to prevent cross contamination	52
4	Placing food in packages, covered containers, and so forth while in storage to prevent cross contamination	43
5	Storing raw meats below ready-to-eat foods to prevent cross contamination	41
6	Properly separating chemicals from food, equipment, single service articles/ single use articles to prevent cross contamination	35
7	In-store produced foods properly date marked to prevent growth of Listeria monocytogenes	33
8	Working containers of chemicals are identified with common name of product	32
9	Allergens disclosed on the product's labeling	29
10	Water supply is protected by installation of a proper backflow device on all food equipment	28

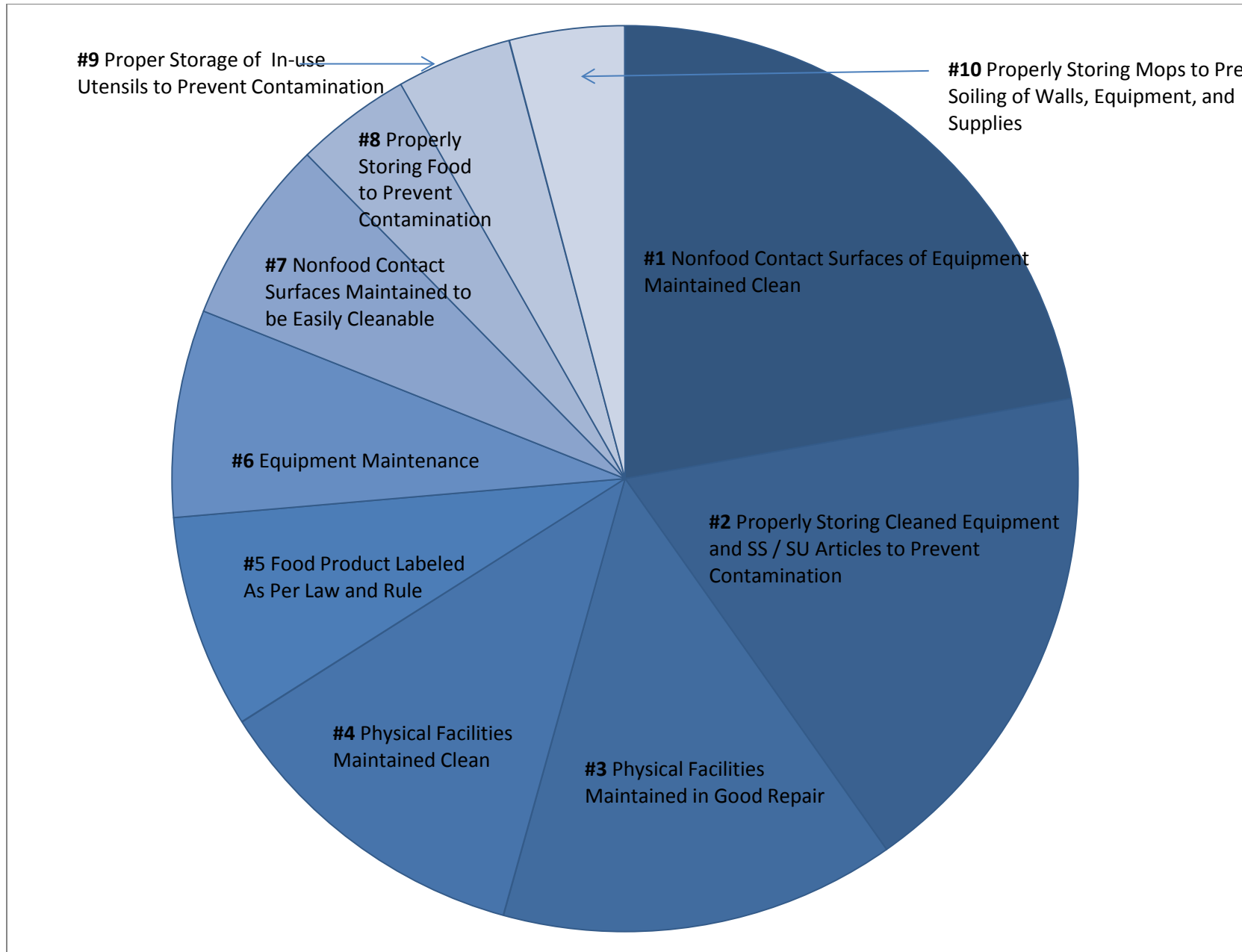
