5534.93, and to repeal sections 4503.431, 7

4503.53, 4503.532, 4503.533, 4503.536, 4503.537, 9
4503.538, 4503.54, 4503.541, 4503.543, 4503.544, 10
4503.547, 4503.548, 4503.581, 4503.59, and 11
4503.731 of the Revised Code to establish a 12
program for the issuance of special license 13
plates related to military service and awards, 14
to create multiple special license plates, to 15
designate multiple memorial highways, and to 16
make multiple special designations. 17

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 5.2281, 4501.21, and 4503.772 be 18
amended and sections 5.074, 5.236, 5.242, 5.243, 5.259, 5.2512, 19



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5.2516, 5.2518, 5.261, 5.281, 5.291, 5.292, 5.481, 5.49, 20
4503.29, 4503.4991, 4503.566, 4503.88, 4503.905, 5534.64, 21
5534.69, 5534.78, 5534.801, 5534.802, 5534.803, and 5534.93 of 22
the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 23

Sec. 5.074. The barn, an agricultural building located on 24
farms and used for many purposes, is hereby designated the 25
official historical architectural structure of the state. 26

Sec. 5.2281. The month of May is designated as "Better 27
Hearing and Speech Month" to increase public awareness of 28
communication disorders and to promote treatment to improve the 29
quality of life of individuals who experience difficulty 30
hearing, understanding, or speaking. 31

The fourteenth day of May is designated as "Childhood 32
Apraxia of Speech Awareness Day" to increase public awareness 33
about childhood apraxia of speech and to support the goals of 34
better hearing and speech month. 35

The period beginning the thirteenth day of March and 36
ending the fifteenth day of April is designated as "Ohio Deaf 37
History Month." 38

Sec. 5.236. The eighth day of July is designated as 39
"Harrison Dillard Day," to commemorate the four-time Olympic 40
champion's accomplishments in earning gold medals in the 1948 41
and 1952 Summer Olympics. Harrison Dillard won Olympic medals in 42
both sprinting and hurdles. 43

Sec. 5.242. The seventh day of October is designated as 44
"Moses Fleetwood Walker Day" in honor of the Ohioan who was the 45
first African-American major league baseball player under 46
contract. 47

In declaring the seventh day of October "Moses Fleetwood 48

Walker Day," the general assembly recognizes the contribution 49
that Moses Fleetwood Walker made to the integration of 50
professional athletics. Born in Mount Pleasant, Ohio, on October 51
7, 1856, Moses Fleetwood Walker played one season with the 52
Toledo Blue Stockings and died in Cleveland, Ohio, in 1924. 53

Sec. 5.243. The twenty-fifth day of May is designated as 54
"Ohio National Missing Children's Day." 55

Sec. 5.259. The month of May is designated as 56
"Neurofibromatosis Awareness Month." 57

Sec. 5.2512. The month of October is designated as "Ohio 58
Chiropractic Awareness Month." 59

Sec. 5.2516. The month of February is designated as "Teen 60
Dating Violence Awareness Month" to increase public awareness of 61
teen dating violence. 62

Sec. 5.2518. The month of June is designated as 63
"Congenital Cytomegalovirus Awareness Month" to increase public 64
awareness of congenital cytomegalovirus and to encourage the 65
testing of newborns for the infection. 66

Sec. 5.261. The twelfth day of September is designated 67
"Jesse Owens Day," in honor of Jesse Owens, a track and field 68
champion and national hero, who was born on that day in 1913. 69
Known affectionately as the Buckeye Bullet, Jesse Owens, 70
representing The Ohio State University, set three world records 71
in the 220-yard dash, the 220-yard low hurdles, and the long 72
jump at the Big Ten track and field finals on May 25, 1935, and, 73
representing the United States at the 1936 Olympic Games in 74
Berlin, Germany, won four gold medals, one each in the 100-meter 75
dash, the 200-meter dash, the long jump, and the 4 x 100-meter 76
relay. 77

Sec. 5.281. The twenty-fourth day of May is designated as 78
"First Responders' Appreciation Day" to recognize individuals 79
who risk their own safety on a daily basis in the execution of 80
their duties to protect the public. 81

Sec. 5.291. The seventeenth day of May is designated as 82
"Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma Awareness Day." 83

Sec. 5.292. The month of May is designated as "Drive Ohio 84
Byways Month" because May is the start of tourism season in 85
Ohio. 86

Sec. 5.481. The first Saturday of May is designated as 87
"Veterans Suicide Awareness Day." 88

Sec. 5.49. The twelfth day of June is designated as 89
"Superman Day" to recognize the Ohio birthplace of one of the 90
creators of the superhero who stood for "truth, justice, and the 91
American way." For on this day, let it be known that Superman is 92
faster than a speeding bullet, more powerful than a locomotive, 93
able to leap tall buildings in a single bound. Look! Up in the 94
sky! It's a bird. It's a plane. It's Superman! 95

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 96
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 97
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 98
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 99
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 100
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4991, 4503.50, 101
4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 4503.521, 102
4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 4503.528, 103
4503.529, 4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 4503.551, 104
4503.552, 4503.553, 4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 4503.561, 105
4503.562, 4503.564, 4503.565, 4503.566, 4503.576, 4503.577, 106

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 114
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 116
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 117
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 118
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 119
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 120
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 121
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 122
other abortion-related activities. 123

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 125
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 126
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 127
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 128
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 129
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 130
other money in that fund. 131

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 132
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 133
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 134
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the

contributions for its research and other programs. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166
receives pursuant to section 4503.4991 of the Revised Code to 167
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 168
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 169
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 171
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 172
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 173
contributions into its general account to be used for 174
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 175
America foundation. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 178
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 179
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 180
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 182
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 183
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 184
scholarships and other educational activities. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 186
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 187
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 188
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 189
that organization. 190

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 191
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 192
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 193

collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 194
section. A university or college that receives contributions 195
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 196
scholarship fund. 197

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 198
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 199
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 200
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 201
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 202
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 203
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 204
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 205
funds as provided in this section. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 207
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 208
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 209
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 210
cyclists of all ages. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 213
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 214
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 215
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 216
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 217
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 220
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 221
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 222
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 223

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession,

to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 254
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 255
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 256
the improvement of patient outcomes. 257

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 258
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 259
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 260
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 261
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 262
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 263
personnel, veterans, and their families. 264

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 265
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 266
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 267
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 268
families. 269

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 270
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 271
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 272
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 273
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 274
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 275
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 276
destination. 277

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 278
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 279
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 280
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 281
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 282

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 283
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 284
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 285
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 286
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 287
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 288
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 289
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 290
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 291
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 292
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 293

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 294
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 295
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 296

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 297
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 298
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 299
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 300
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 301
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 302
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 303
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 304
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 305
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 306
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 307
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 308
under this section. 309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 310
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 311
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 312

the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 313
programs. 314

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 315
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 316
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 317
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 318

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 319
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 320
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 321
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 322
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 325
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 326
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 327
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 328
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 329
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 330
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 331
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 332
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 333
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 334
such payments are to be made. 335

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 336
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 337
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 338
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 339
river watershed. 340

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 341

receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 342
Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute 343
to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 346
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 347
the money in support of the park. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 350
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 351
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 354
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 355
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 356
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 357
local beekeeping programs. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 360
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 361
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 362
legends to inspire future leaders. 363

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 364
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 365
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 366
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 367
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 368
commission and that is participating in the license plate 369
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 370

of the county of residence of an applicant. 371

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 372
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 373
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 374
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 375
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 376
(G) of that section. 377

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 378
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 379
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 380
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 381
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 382
Ohio and for educational programs. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 385
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 386
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 387
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 389
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 390
great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 391
America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 392
equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 393
the girl scouts. 394

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 395
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 396
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 397
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 398
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the fees into its general account to be used for purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement methods, and teaching respect for law and order.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio concerns of police survivors, which shall use those contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed in the line of duty.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater

Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 429
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 430
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 433
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 434
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 435
families. 436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 438
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 439
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 440
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 441
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 442
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 443
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 444
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 445
participating in that program. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 448
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 449
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 450

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 451
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 452
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 453
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 454
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 456
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 457

Siegel & Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 458
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 459
Cleveland, Ohio. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 462
Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in 463
whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 464
resides. 465

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 466
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 467
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 468
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 469
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 470
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 471

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 472
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 473
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 474
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 475
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 476
rotary foundation. 477

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 478
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 479
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 480
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 481
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 482

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 483
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 484
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 485
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 486

registrar shall collect a contribution of thirty dollars. The 1003
registrar shall deposit all such contributions into the state 1004
treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution fund 1005
created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1006

(2) The registrar shall deposit the bureau of motor 1007
vehicles administrative fee of ten dollars, the purpose of which 1008
is to compensate the bureau for additional services required in 1009
the issuing of "Cuyahoga Valley Career Center" license plates, 1010
into the state treasury to the credit of the public safety - 1011
highway purposes fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised 1012
Code. 1013

(D) Sections 4503.77 and 4503.78 of the Revised Code do 1014
not apply to license plates issued under this section. 1015

Sec. 5534.64. In addition to any other name in the Revised 1016
Code or otherwise, the southbound lane of state route number 1017
seven, from mile marker twelve to mile marker eight in Jefferson 1018
county only, shall be known as the "U.S. Air Force Staff 1019

4503.547, 4503.548, 4503.581, 4503.59, and 4503.731 of the 1078
Revised Code are hereby repealed. 1079

Section 3. Until such time as the rules adopted under 1080
section 4503.29 of the Revised Code as enacted by this act are 1081
effective, the Registrar of Motor Vehicles shall continue to 1082

issue the military nonstandard license plates required to be 1083
issued under sections 4503.431, 4503.432, 4503.433, 4503.434, 1084
4503.48, 4503.481, 4503.53, 4503.532, 4503.533, 4503.536, 1085
4503.537, 4503.538, 4503.54, 4503.541, 4503.543, 4503.544, 1086
4503.547, 4503.548, 4503.581, 4503.59, and 4503.731 of the 1087
Revised Code as those sections existed prior to their repeal by 1088
this act. Thereafter those nonstandard license plates shall be 1089
issued in accordance with rules as required under division (C) 1090
of section 4503.29 of the Revised Code. 1091

Section 4. As soon as rules adopted under section 4503.29 1092
of the Revised Code as enacted by this act are effective, the 1093
Director of Veterans Services and the Registrar of Motor 1094
Vehicles shall establish, in accordance with those rules, the 1095
"Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal" and the "Ohio National Guard 1096
Ohio Cross" license plates. 1097
