Sub. Bill Comparative Synopsis

This table summarizes how the latest substitute version of the bill differs from the "As Introduced" version. It addresses only the topics on which the two versions differ substantively. It does not list topics on which the two bills are substantively the same.

Topic	Previous Version (As Introduced)	Sub. Version (L_132_1751-3)
Intellectual property belonging to a charter county hospital	Uses inconsistent terms to describe the charter county hospital's ownership of intellectual property.	Clarifies throughout the bill that the hospital has "rights to, interests in, and income from intellectual property, including discoveries, inventions, or patents."
Transfer of intellectual property	Uses inconsistent terms to describe in what manner and to whom the board of county hospital trustees of a charter county hospital may transfer intellectual property.	Clarifies throughout the bill that the hospital's rights and interests in, and income from, intellectual property may be assigned, licensed, transferred, sold, or otherwise disposed of, to individuals, firms, associations, corporations, and governmental agencies.
Charter county hospital board's rulemaking	Authorizes the board to establish rules under which an employee may solicit, accept, or receive a financial interest in any firm, corporation, or other association.	Requires the board to adopt rules.
Role of the Ohio Ethics Commission	Describes the Commission's authority to provide assistance to the hospital board using vague language.	Specifies that the Commission, at the board's request, must advise the board in implementing the board's rules and address any matter that is outside the scope of those rules.

Topic	Previous Version (As Introduced)	Sub. Version (L_132_1751-3)
Name of the board	Refers to the board as the "charter county hospital board of trustees."	Changes the board's name to be consistent with existing law, which refers to the board as "the board of county hospital trustees of a charter county hospital."

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
