"Sec. 5.036. A shelter pet is hereby designated as the 25
official pet of the state to raise public awareness of shelter 26
animals. 27

Sec. 5.074. The barn, an agricultural building located on 28
farms and used for many purposes, is hereby designated the 29
official historical architectural structure of the state. 30

Sec. 5.2315. The month of October shall be designated as 31
"Ohio Principals Month" to honor the service of all elementary, 32
middle, and high school principals and to recognize the importance 33
of school leadership in ensuring that every child has access to a 34
high-quality education. 35

Sec. 5.243. The sixteenth day of July is designated as 36
"National Atomic Veterans Day" in this state to raise awareness of 37
the health issues many atomic veterans suffer as a result of their 38
service and sacrifice. 39

Sec. 5.244. The month of June is designated as "Alzheimer's 40
and Brain Awareness Month." 41

Sec. 5.245. The second week of October is designated as "Ohio 42
Covered Bridge Week." 43

Sec. 5.2512. The thirtieth day of January is designated as "Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy Awareness Day" to raise public awareness about chronic traumatic encephalopathy and those affected by it.

Sec. 5.2571. The sixth day of October is designated as "S.M.A.R.T. Parent Day," to remind parents to have conversations with their children about Social Media Awareness, Respect, and Timing.

Sec. 5.262. The twelfth day of September is designated "Jesse Owens Day," in honor of Jesse Owens, a track and field champion and national hero, who was born on that day in 1913. Known affectionately as the Buckeye Bullet, Jesse Owens, representing The Ohio State University, set three world records in the 220-yard dash, the 220-yard low hurdles, and the long jump at the Big Ten track and field finals on May 25, 1935, and, representing the United States at the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin, Germany, won four gold medals, one each in the 100-meter dash, the 200-meter dash, the long jump, and the 4 x 100-meter relay.

Sec. 5.263. The month of September is designated "We Card Month" to encourage retailers to ask for identification from each person who attempts to purchase age-restricted products in order to prevent sales of those products to minors.

Sec. 5.264. The month of April is designated as "Sarcoidosis Awareness Month."

Sec. 5.481. The first Saturday of May is designated as "Veterans Suicide Awareness Day."

Sec. 5.49. The twelfth day of June is designated as "Superman Day" to recognize the Ohio birthplace of one of the creators of the superhero who stood for "truth, justice, and the American way." For on this day, let it be known that Superman is faster than a speeding bullet, more powerful than a locomotive, able to leap tall buildings in a single bound. Look! Up in the sky! It's a bird. It's a plane. It's Superman!"

the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 116

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 119

Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism 121
awareness efforts throughout the state. 122

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 123
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 124
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 125
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 126
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 127
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 128

assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 129
 directly to their clients. 130

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 131
 receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 132
 national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 133
 it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 134
 pancreatic cancer and their families. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 136
 receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 137
 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 138
 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 139
 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 141
 receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 142
 St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 143
 its research and other programs. 144

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 145
 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 146
 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for 147
 its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 149
 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 150
 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 151
 contributions for its research and other programs. 152

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 153
 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the 154
 KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise 155
 awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine 156
 glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 157

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 158
 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the 159
 research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's 160
 hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for 161
 the cure of childhood cancers. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163
 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 164
 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 165
 contributions into its general account to be used for educational 166
 and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America 167
 foundation. 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169
 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 170
 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 171
 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the 172
 expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 173

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 174
 to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio cattlemen's 175
 foundation, which shall use those contributions for scholarships 176
 and other educational activities. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 178
 to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the organization Ohio 179
 region phi theta kappa, which shall use those contributions for 180
 scholarships for students who are members of that organization. 181

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 182
 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 183
 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 184
 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 185
 section. A university or college that receives contributions from 186
 the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 187

scholarship fund. 188

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying the expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, educational, and cultural events at the monument. 203 204 205 206 207 208 209

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the lighthouses of fairport harbor. 210 211 212 213 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 215 216 217

contributions only to promote and support the football team of 218
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 219

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 220
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 221
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-four, 222
and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district 223
shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the 224
educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors 225

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and cats and for educational

programs concerning the proper veterinary care of those animals, 278
 and for expenses of the Ohio pet fund that are reasonably 279
 necessary for it to obtain and maintain its tax-exempt status and 280
 to perform its duties. 281

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 282
 receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 283
 rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 284

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 285
 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 286
 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation. 287
 Except as provided in division (B) of this section, the coalition 288
 shall distribute the money to its members, and the members shall 289
 use the money only to pay for educational, charitable, and other 290
 programs of each coalition member that provide care for unwanted, 291
 abused, and neglected horses. The Ohio coalition for animals may 292
 use a portion of the money to pay for reasonable marketing costs 293

 contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 305
 receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 306
 Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 307

negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions 308
for charitable and educational purposes. 309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 310
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 311
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 312
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 313
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 314
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks 315
unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the 316
purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands 317
and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of 318
ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in 319
writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments 320
are to be made. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 322
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 323
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 324
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river 325
watershed. 326

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 327
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 328
Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute to 329
pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 332
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the 333
money in support of the park. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 336
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions 337

for wildlife preservation purposes. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization. 339
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs. 343
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders. 349
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The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective of the county of residence of an applicant. 354
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The registrar shall pay to a community charity each contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (G) of that section. 362
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, which shall use the contributions for the protection and preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in Ohio and for educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of supporting cancer research.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the fees into its general account to be used for purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement methods, and teaching respect for law and order.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio concerns of police survivors, which shall use those contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed in the line of duty.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in

the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 429
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions to 430
recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 431
families. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433

association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 436

B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into 449
its general account to be used for purposes of Wright B. Flyer, 450
incorporated. 451

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 452
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 453
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 454
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 455
Cleveland, Ohio. 456

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting law enforcement education and assistance.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the rotary foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to

buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the contributions 487
to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 489
