

House Transportation and Public Safety Committee

Minutes

April 26, 2017

Chairman Green called the meeting of the House Transportation and Public Safety Committee to order with prayer at 9:05 am in Statehouse Room 017. Attendance was taken and a quorum was not present. The committee proceeded as a subcommittee.

Chairman Green called up House Bill 136 for its first hearing.

- Chairman Green recognized Rep. Steven Arndt to provide sponsor testimony of House Bill 136.
- Chairman Green recognized Mr. Todd Thorbahn to provide proponent testimony of House Bill 136. Mr. Thorbahn answered the questions of the committee.

Chairman Greenspan called up House Bill 140 for its first hearing.

- Chairman Greenspan recognized Rep. Doug Green to provide sponsor testimony of House Bill 140. Rep. Green answered the questions of the committee.

Chairman Green called up House Bill 83 for its first hearing.

- Chairman Green recognized Reps. K. Smith & Howse to provide sponsor testimony of House Bill 83. Reps. K. Smith & Howse answered the questions of the committee.

A quorum was achieved. The committee proceeded as a full committee. The minutes from March 29, 2017 were approved without objection.

- Vice Chairman Greenspan moved to favorably report House Bill 136. The bill was favorably reported by a vote of 11-0. At the Chair's discretion the roll was left open in the clerk's office until 10:00 am the next day.
- Vice Chairman Greenspan moved to favorably report House Bill 140. The bill was favorably reported by a vote of 11-0. At the Chair's discretion the roll was left open in the clerk's office until 10:00 am the next day.

Chairman Green called up House Bill 60 for its third hearing.

- Chairman Green recognized Mr. James Moyer to provide opponent testimony of House Bill 60. Mr. Moyer answered the questions of the committee.

Chairman Green called up House Bill 95 for its third hearing.

- Rep. James Hughes moved to substitute House Bill 95 with 0084-1. Rep. Hughes explained the changes in the substitute bill to the committee. The motion was agreed to without objection.
- Chairman Green recognized Ms. Patricia Kovacs to provide proponent testimony of House Bill 95. Ms. Kovacs answered the questions of the committee.
