

## House Transportation and Public Safety Committee

### Minutes

September 13, 2017

Chairman Green called the meeting of the House Transportation and Public Safety Committee to order with prayer at 9:02 am in Statehouse Room 017. Attendance was taken and a quorum was not present. The committee proceeded as a subcommittee.

Vice Chairman Greenspan called up House Bill 257 for its first hearing.

- Vice Chairman Greenspan recognized Rep. Doug Green to provide sponsor testimony of House Bill 257. Rep. Green answered the questions of the committee.
- Rep. DeVitis moved to favorably report House Bill 257. The bill was favorably reported by a vote of 10-0. At the Chair's discretion, the roll was left open in the clerk's office until 10:00 am the next day.

A quorum was achieved. The committee proceeded as a full committee.

Chairman Green called up House Bill 261 for its first hearing.
