

Senator Obhof reports for the standing committee on Rules and Reference, recommending that the following bills and resolution, standing in order for second consideration, be referred to committee as recommended:

**Sub. H. B. No. 50 – Representative Schaffer, et al.**

To amend sections 4501.27, 5101.33, and 5101.542 and to enact section 5101.331 of the Revised Code to establish requirements for electronic benefit transfer cards issued under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

To the Committee on Health, Human Services and Medicaid.

**Sub. H. B. No. 119 – Representatives Henne, McColley, et al.**

To amend sections 5101.47, 5101.54, and 5160.47 and to enact sections 5160.29, 5160.291, 5160.292, and 5160.293 of the Revised Code regarding eligibility and benefits under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance program and the Medicaid program.

To the Committee on Health, Human Services and Medicaid.

**H. B. No. 133 – Representative Ryan, et al.**

To amend sections 111.16, 718.01, 718.05, 1329.01, 4123.01, 4141.42, 5741.02, 5747.01, and 5751.01 and to enact sections 1701.041, 4799.04, and 5703.94 of the Revised Code to create the Disaster Relief Act to exempt out-of-state disaster businesses and qualifying out-of-state employees from certain taxes and laws with respect to disaster work on critical infrastructure performed in this state during a declared disaster.

To amend sections 2923.12, 2923.126, 2923.128, and 2923.16 of the Revised Code to modify the requirement that a concealed handgun licensee notify a law enforcement officer that the licensee is carrying a concealed handgun when stopped.

To amend sections 1721.21, 1721.211, 4717.03, 4717.13, 4717.14, 4717.36, 4767.01, 4767.02, 4767.03, 4767.04, 4767.05, 4767.06, 4767.07, and 4767.08 and to enact sections 4767.021, 4767.09, 4767.10, and 4767.11 of the Revised Code to modify duties of the Division of Real Estate in the Department of Commerce regarding cemetery registration, to specify cemetery owners must reasonably maintain cemeteries, to establish the Cemetery Grant Program, to allow the Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors to review and vote upon certain license suspensions by telephone, to make various other changes to the embalmers, funeral directors, and crematory licensing laws, and to make an appropriation.

To enact section 4503.29 and to repeal sections 4503.431, 4503.432, 4503.433, 4503.434, 4503.48, 4503.481, 4503.53, 4503.532, 4503.533, 4503.536, 4503.537, 4503.538, 4503.54, 4503.541, 4503.543, 4503.544, 4503.547, 4503.548, 4503.571, 4503.581, 4503.59, and 4503.731 of the Revised Code to establish a program for the issuance of special license plates related to military service and awards.

**H. B. No. 214 – Representatives LaTourette, Merrin, et al.**

To amend section 3701.79 and to enact sections 2919.10 and 2919.101 of the Revised Code to prohibit a person from performing, inducing, or attempting to perform or induce an abortion on a pregnant woman who is seeking the abortion because an unborn child has or may have Down Syndrome.

**Am. H. B. No. 226 – Representatives Seitz, Sweeney, et al.**

To amend sections 1705.48, 3737.51, 3737.71, 3737.99, 3743.04, 3743.17, 3743.44, 3743.45, 3743.60, 3743.61, 3743.63, 3743.65, 3743.75, 3743.99, 5703.052, 5703.053, 5703.19, 5703.70, and 5703.77 and to enact sections 3737.04, 3737.05, 3737.06, 3737.07, 3737.08, 3737.09, 3737.10, 3737.11, 3737.12, 3743.46, 3743.47, 3743.591, and 3743.67 of the Revised Code to establish a fireworks study group to review and make recommendations regarding the Fireworks Law, to extend to July 1, 2020, the moratorium on issuing fireworks manufacturer and wholesaler licenses, to eliminate, beginning January 1, 2021, the moratorium on geographic transfer of fireworks manufacturer and wholesaler licenses, and, beginning January 1, 2021, to impose a fee on the retail sale of consumer grade fireworks in this state and to expand the ability of individuals to obtain 1.3G display fireworks and obtain and use 1.4G consumer fireworks.

To amend section 5747.24 of the Revised Code to modify the test for determining an individual's state of residence for income tax purposes.

To enact section 5534.95 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 348 in Scioto County as the "Roy Rogers Happy Trails Highway."

To amend section 5733.40 of the Revised Code to provide that wages and guaranteed payments paid by a professional employer organization to the owner of a pass-through entity that has contracted with the organization may be considered business income.

To urge Congress to enact legislation requiring commercial trucks to use side guards and establishing side guard technical specifications.

To enact section 5.50 of the Revised Code to designate the last week of September as "Diaper Need Awareness Week."

To amend section 2313.06 of the Revised Code to require the names submitted by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to the commissioners of jurors to be included on the annual jury source list compiled by the commissioners.

To amend sections 718.02 and 718.82 of the Revised Code to reinstate the municipal income tax "throw-back rule" used in apportioning business income among municipalities.

To amend sections 3505.03, 3505.04, and 3513.13 of the Revised Code to require uncontested races to appear at the end of an election ballot.

**S. B. No. 213 – Senator Schiavoni, et al.**

To amend sections 122.17, 122.171, 122.174, 321.24, 323.152, 323.153, 4503.065, 4503.066, 5104.30, 5725.98, 5726.98, 5729.98, 5747.01, 5747.02, 5747.98, 5748.01, and 5751.98 and to enact sections 122.084, 122.178, 122.891, 5709.29, 5747.61, 5751.55, 6301.021, 6303.01, and 6303.02 of the Revised Code to enhance economic and employment opportunities and improve local infrastructure in Ohio by providing additional assistance to workforce development and employment programs; establishing a revolving loan program for small businesses seeking to expand operations;

extending job tax credits to smaller businesses; enabling expanded participation in public sector contracting by smaller companies; enhancing support for child care centers; funding additional local infrastructure and public transit; authorizing tax incentives for hiring military veterans, for donating money to local programs assisting distressed communities, or for improving distressed property; exempting the homes of disabled veterans from property taxation; terminating the income tax deduction and reduced tax rate for business income; and to make an appropriation.

To enact sections 3962.01, 3962.02, 3962.03, 3962.04, 3962.05, 3962.06, 3962.07, 3962.08, 3962.09, 3962.10, 3962.11, 3962.12, 3962.13, 3962.14, 3962.15, 3962.16, 3962.17, and 3962.18 of the Revised Code to create the Ohio Pharmaceutical Assistance Program in the Department of Insurance to provide assistance with the cost of prescription drugs for certain seniors, the disabled, veterans, and certain persons who are covered under a Bronze Health Plan sold in the Health Insurance Marketplace established by federal law.

To amend section 1345.99 and to enact section 1345.022 of the Revised Code to prohibit the installation of unsafe used tires on certain motor vehicles.

To amend section 5739.02 of the Revised Code to exempt from sales and use tax goods purchased by a foreign citizen or entity if the goods are in Ohio only temporarily for package consolidation before being delivered to a foreign address, and to declare an emergency.

**S. B. No. 225 – Senators Schiavoni, Eklund, et al.**

To amend section 184.10 and to enact sections 122.97, 122.971, 122.972, 122.973, 122.974, 122.975, 122.976, 122.977, and 122.978 of the Revised Code to create the Ohio Broadband Development Grant Program and to make an appropriation.

To the Committee on Finance.

**S. B. No. 226 – Senator Bacon, et al.**

To amend sections 5739.02, 5739.03, and 5739.05 of the Revised Code to provide for a permanent three-day sales tax "holiday" each August during which sales of clothing and school supplies are exempt from sales and use tax.

**S. B. No. 227 – Senator Huffman, et al.**

To amend section 3904.13 and to enact section 3901.89 of the Revised Code to require health plan issuers to release certain claim information to group plan policyholders.

**S. B. No. 230 – Senator Obhof**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to create the "Medina County" license plate.

To the Committee on Transportation, Commerce and Workforce.

**S. B. No. 231 – Senator Gardner**

To amend sections 2967.121, 5120.07, and 5120.114, to enact sections 2903.41, 2903.42, 2903.43, and 2903.44, and to repeal section 2967.122 of the Revised Code to provide for a violent offender database, require violent offenders to enroll in the database, and name those provisions of the act "Sierah's Law;" to modify the membership and duties of the Ex-Offender Reentry Coalition and eliminate its repeal; to require halfway houses to use the single validated risk assessment tool for adult offenders that the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction has developed; and to provide that the notice of release from prison of specified serious offense offenders that is given to sheriffs is to be the same as that provided to prosecuting attorneys and eliminate the notice to sheriffs regarding pardons, commutations, paroles, and transitional control transfers of offenders.
