Subject: Designates the Officer Tommy Hayes Memorial Highway

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$350 to \$400 in costs for producing and installing a set of memorial signs for this memorial highway. Specifically, the bill designates the stretch of Interstate 71 between State Route 161 and Morse Road within Franklin County as the Officer Tommy Hayes Memorial Highway. If a memorial marker is to be located on an interstate route, ODOT produces and installs the signs. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
