Despite the abuse, darkness, and circumstances of being a victim of domestic violence that almost took her life in 2014, Aisha lived a COURAGEOUS and LOVING LIFE. She was the BEST MOM I ever seen. She LOVED the girls so much and her actions had their best interest at heart constantly. Nothing made her HAPPIER than spending moments with her girls, her parents, family, friends, and me. I have no idea how she had the capacity to give so much to so many people in such a fulfilling way, with this coward constantly hovering over her life.

If Aisha had the kind of support she is receiving currently regarding intimate partner/domestic violence in 2014 after the first public attack, I believe she would be here today. Violence against women is an epidemic and as a human being, father of a 15-year-old daughter, and Aisha's partner in life, I am beyond disgusted with this issue.

The perpetual emptiness, sadness, unrepairable heartbreak and anger I feel about losing Aisha Millicent Fraser my birthday twin, best friend, and my future wife can't be resolved by this law. But if Aisha's Law is the moment that brings real protection for women and children and her name and story is the impetus for that, then this law has my full support.
