

Sports Wagers Listed in HB 194

- **Exchange Wagering / Moneyline (Odds)** – A simple, outright bet on the outcome of a game.
Example: Betting 2:1 odds that the Reds will beat the Yankees.
- **Parlay** – A linked set of bets, which pays out only if *all* bets in the parlay win.
Example: Betting that the Blue Jackets will score more than 4 goals AND Alexandre Texier will get a hat trick.
- **Over-Under** – A bet on whether the combined score (or some other statistic) will be greater than or less than a certain number.
Example: Betting that the sum of Ohio State’s final score and Michigan’s final score will be less than 35.
- **In-Game Wagering** – Similar to Exchange Wagering, but placed during the game instead of before.
Example: Betting on Day 3, Hole 9 that Tiger Woods will win the Masters.
- **Single-Game Bet** – Straightforward; betting on a single game rather than a series, or linked bets.
Example: Betting that the Bengals will win their Week 6 game.
- **Teaser Bet** – Similar to a parlay, but combining the spread for multiple games.
 - **Spread** – A bet on the margin of victory.
Example: Betting that the Crew will win by more than 3 goals.
- **In-Play** – Any type of “real-time” bet on a certain event within the game.
Example: Betting that the Cavaliers’ next basket will be a 3-pointer.
- **Proposition** – A bet on whether a certain occurrence, unrelated to the final outcome, will happen during a game.
Example: Betting that Baker Mayfield will throw for more yards than Ben Roethlisberger.
- **Pool / Pari-Mutuel** – Multiple bettors “buying in” to the same market, with the payout divided among the winners.
Example: Picking the Indians to win the World Series in an office bracket.
