H. B. No. 63 – Representatives Lipps, West

Regarding pharmacy benefit managers, pharmacists, and the disclosure to patients of drug price information.

To designate a portion of State Route 53 in Ottawa County as the "Catawba Island Township Veterans Memorial Highway."

Regarding parental notice of serious risks to the health or safety of children receiving child care.
