Referral Report

Representative Sykes reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

H. B. No. 418 – Representatives Clites, Carruthers

Regarding prescription drugs and medication switching.

To the committee on Health

H. B. No. 419 – Representative Swearingen

To exempt the seasonal storage or use of certain watercraft purchased outside Ohio from state and local use taxes.

To the committee on Ways and Means

To increase the frequency at which a pharmacist may refill certain prescriptions on an emergency basis and to require health benefit plans to cover drugs dispensed in those situations.
