Referral Report

February 19, 2020

Representative Sykes reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

H. B. No. 498 – Representative Fraizer

To authorize a refundable income tax credit for disability-related home expenses.

To the committee on Aging and Long-Term Care

H. B. No. 499 – Representatives Kelly, Lang

To authorize a county to implement a motor fuel quality testing program.

To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety

H. B. No. 500 – Representatives Kick, McClain

To allow certain persons to petition for visitation with an incompetent or ward if visitation has been interfered with or denied.

To the committee on Civil Justice

H. B. No. 501 – Representatives Wiggam, Kick

To clarify the law governing slow-moving vehicles and to revise the lighting and reflective material requirements applicable to animal-drawn vehicles.

To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety

H. B. No. 502 – Representative Crossman

To adopt several jail reform procedures related to compliance with the Minimum Standards for Jails in Ohio.

To the committee on Criminal Justice

H. B. No. 503 – Representative Lightbody

To protect minors by prohibiting certain licensed health care professionals from engaging in conversion therapy when treating minor patients.

H. B. No. 504 – Representative Sweeney

To prescribe a per pupil funding guarantee for certain school districts and to make an appropriation.

To eliminate the specific authority of residential facilities to operate within residential zoning districts.

To prohibit, unless determined to be in a child's best interest, placement of the child with a relative the child does not know or has never met.

To prohibit enforcement of delinquent property tax liens against owner-occupied homesteads and to require that any delinquent tax be paid before the title to a homestead may be transferred.

To allow an individual to be eligible for unemployment compensation benefits for unemployment due to domestic violence.
