"Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to sections

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 40
collects in the fund as follows: 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 42
to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund 43
of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that 44
provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients 45
and that improve access for such patients to quality health care 46
and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for 47
abortion information, counseling, services, or other 48
abortion-related activities. 49

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 109
 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 110
 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the 111
 expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 112

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 113
 to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio cattlemen's 114
 foundation, which shall use those contributions for scholarships 115
 and other educational activities. 116

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 117
 to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the organization Ohio 118
 region phi theta kappa, which shall use those contributions for 119
 scholarships for students who are members of that organization. 120

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 121
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to Ohio 122
demolay, which shall use the contributions for scholarships, 123
educational programs, and any other programs or events the 124
organization holds or sponsors in this state. 125

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 126
 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 127
 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 128
 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 129
 section. A university or college that receives contributions from 130
 the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 131
 scholarship fund. 132

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 133
 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 134
 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 135
 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 136
 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 137
 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 138

The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio cyclists of all ages.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying the expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, educational, and cultural events at the monument.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the lighthouses of fairport harbor.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the

educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors 169
 within this state. 170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 171
 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 172
 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 173
 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 174
 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 175
 activities. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177
 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 178
 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 179
 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its 180
 mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to 181
 children, young adults, and families in this state. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183
 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 184
 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 185
 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to 186
 assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to 187
 assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their 188
 education, and to support persons conducting nursing research 189
 concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the 190
 improvement of patient outcomes. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 192
 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 193
 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 194
 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 195
 organization in paying for the charitable activities and programs 196
 it sponsors in support of United States military personnel, 197
 veterans, and their families. 198

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and cats and for educational programs concerning the proper veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the members shall use the money only to pay for educational, charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received under this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the western reserve historical society, which shall use the contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person

who paid the contribution resides. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made. 260-271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed. 272-276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 277-280

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park. 281-284

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 285-288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective of the county of residence of an applicant.

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (G) of that section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 319
 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, which 320
 shall use the contributions for the protection and preservation of 321
 the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in Ohio and for 322
 educational programs. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324
 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 325
 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 326
 supporting cancer research. 327

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 328
 receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 329
 Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331
 receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 332
 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall 333
 distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the 334
 state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 335

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 336
 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 337
~~great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of~~ 338
~~America Ohio's heartland~~. The ~~council~~ girl scouts of Ohio's 339
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 340
 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 341
 scouts. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343
 receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 344
 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall 345
 distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the 346
 state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 348
 receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 349
 Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which 350
 shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352
 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 353
 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 354
 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable 355
 purposes. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357

 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for purposes 360

 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 369
 to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio concerns of police 370
 survivors, which shall use those contributions to provide whatever 371
 assistance may be appropriate to the families of Ohio law 372
 enforcement officers who are killed in the line of duty. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 374
 to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater Cleveland 375
 peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 376
 contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 377

the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant 379
to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of 380
chiefs of police. 381

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 382
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 383
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions to 384
recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 385
families. 386

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 387
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 388
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 389
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 390
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 391
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 392
administering a program to secure the proper representation in the 393
courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent children, 394
and for the training and supervision of persons participating in 395
that program. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 398
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 399
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 400

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 401
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 402
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall split 403
the contributions between that chapter and the ALS association 404
northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any agreement between the 405
two associations. The contributions shall be used to discover 406
treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for, and 407

empower people affected by ALS to live their lives to the fullest.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for purposes of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in Cleveland, Ohio.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting law enforcement education and assistance.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 437
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 438
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 439
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the rotary 440
foundation. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 443
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 444
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 445
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 448
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the contributions 449
to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 450

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 451
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 452
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 453
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 454
connection. 455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 456
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 457
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 458
contributions to distribute between the various historical 459
societies and museums in Medina county. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461
receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 462
Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 463
contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 464
scholarship purposes. 465

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the contributions to provide scholarships to spouses and children either of disabled veterans or of members of any branch of the armed forces who died during their service.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area research projects.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those contributions solely to promote and support the historical preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the Solon city school district. The school district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students

regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide 496
 prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 497
 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 498
 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate school 499
 counselors shall determine any charitable organizations that the 500
 school district hires to provide those services. The school 501
 district also may use the contributions it receives to pay for 502
 members of the faculty of the school district to receive training 503
 in providing such services to the students of the school district. 504
 The school district shall ensure that any charitable organization 505
 that is hired by the district is exempt from federal income 506
 taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. 507
 The school district shall not use the contributions it receives 508
 for any other purpose. 509

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 510
 receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the 511
 Canton city school district. The district may use the 512
 contributions for student welfare, but shall not use the 513
