### RESOLUTION NO. 19-R-103

#### A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE OHIO STATE LEGISLATURE HONOR MATHEW J. MAZANY BY DEDICATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 2 IN HIS MEMORY

WHEREAS, Mathew J. Mazany served the City of Mentor, Ohio faithfully and honorably as a Police Patrolman from December 15, 2003 until his death in the line of duty on June 24, 2018; and,

WHEREAS, Patrolman Mazany Officer Mazany served the Mentor Police Department with distinction for over fourteen years and was the recipient of the department's Exceptional Service Award; and,

WHEREAS, over his career he consistently received letters from grateful residents on his professional and compassionate interaction with them; and,

WHEREAS, it was his life ambition since childhood to follow in his father's footsteps and become a police officer; and,

WHEREAS, the job of a police officer is inherently laden with risk. Yet these brave men and women accept that risk in service to their communities and the people they are sworn to protect. Despite this knowledge, we find ourselves shocked and heartbroken when a life is lost as a result of that service. These very special public servants are truly among the best our society offers and our most selfless resource; and,

WHEREAS, the Mentor City Council and administration, the police officers and co-workers he served with, and the residents of this City are very proud of and grateful to Mathew J. Mazany for what he gave to this community in life, and wish to always remember his great sacrifice;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MENTOR, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the City of Mentor Council honors the life and service to the City of Mentor of Mathew J. Mazany, who gave his life in the performance of his duty as a Police Officer, and respectfully requests that the Ohio State Legislature forever honor his memory by dedicating the portion of State Route 2 between State Route 306 and State Route 615 in his name.

SECTION 2. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to forward this resolution to District 60 State Representative John M. Rogers, District 61 State Representative Jamie Callender, District 18 State Senator John J. Eklund and District 25 State Senator Kenny Yuko.



SECTION 4. That this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption at the earliest period allowed by law.




