The Ohio Invasive Plants Council (OIPC), formed in 2005, is a coalition of organizations and individuals throughout Ohio who have a mutual interest in Ohio's natural ecosystems and the effects of invasive plants and other organisms on their biological diversity. The Council participates in statewide efforts to address the threats of invasive species to Ohio's ecosystems and economy by providing leadership and promoting stewardship, education, research, and information exchange. Education and information exchange are part of OIPC's mission and we have a history of providing educational workshops, materials, and conferences, as well as research opportunities.
