

**OHIO SENATE**  
**Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources Minutes**  
**May 6, 2020**  
**133rd General Assembly**

The Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee was called to order pursuant to the meeting notice at approximately 9:05 a.m. in the Finance Hearing Room of the Statehouse.

Attendance was taken. A quorum was present.

The minutes of the previous two meetings were approved without objection, correction, or addition.
