

## SB 191 Opponent

Good afternoon Chairman Coley, Vice Chair Huffman, and Ranking member Craig and members of the Government Oversight and Reform Committee. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on SB 191.

My name is Angela Davis. I am an author, conservative blogger, political activist, and former small business owner who will be running as a write in candidate on the Republican ticket for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Congressional District. I do support the concept behind SB 191, however, I have grave concerns about the integrity and security of not just the online system, but also about the integrity of the US Postal Service and it's ability to ensure that voters' absentee ballots actually reach their destination and are fully accounted for.

In the last year, I have submitted proof to the Columbus Police Dept, as well as to US Representative Joyce Beatty, that several pieces of certified mail had not reached their destination. What's more is that a review of two different tracking systems showed conflicting information. One tracking system showed the mail to have never arrived including a letter sent to the FBI over a year earlier. Yet another tracking system showed all of them having reached their destination. Most of the nine certified letters were addressed to state and federal law enforcement, prosecutors and lawyers. All nine were concerning a politically connected developer who spent 3 years in federal prison for public corruption.

Considering that absentee ballots can actually determine the outcome of an election, as evidenced in 2018 elections in our local elections, I think more oversight and investigation of the electronic system and the procedures at our post office locations should be looked at more thoroughly, so that we can pass SB 191 after having addressed these issues.
