

OHIO SENATE
Committee on Rules and Reference Minutes
March 4, 2020
133rd General Assembly

Chairman Obhof called the meeting to order.
Attendance was taken. A quorum was present.

The Chair called for a motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. Senator Williams moved that the minutes be accepted without changes or corrections. Senator Wilson seconded the motion. Hearing no objections, the minutes were accepted as written.

The first order of business was reports to committees of appointments by the Governor: Higher Education - Judiciary - Transportation, Commerce and Workforce.
All the reports were properly signed.

The second order of business was the Advise and Consent report of appointments by the Governor. Senator Eklund moved that the report be referred to the floor. Senator Thomas seconded the motion. The report was referred to the floor by a vote of 13-0 and the report was properly signed.

The third order of business was the Reference Report for Wednesday, March 4, 2020. Senator Burke moved that the report be referred to the floor. Senator Coley seconded the motion. The report was referred to the floor by a vote of 13-0 and the report was properly signed.

The fourth order of business was the calendar for Wednesday, March 4, 2020:

The Chair called up S.C.R. No. 7 (Craig/Antonio) Support screening Asian-Americans for type 2 diabetes.

Senator Kunze moved S.C.R. No. 7, seconded by Senator Williams. S.C.R. No. 7 was referred to the floor by a vote of 13-0.

The Chair called up S.B. No. 212 (Schuring) Authorize areas in which new homes and improvements tax exempt.

Senator O'Brien moved S.B. No. 212, seconded by Senator Hottinger. S.B. No. 212 was referred to the floor by a vote of 13-0.

The Chair called up S.B. No. 260 (S. Huffman) Regards abortion-inducing drugs.

Senator Coley moved S.B. No. 260, seconded by Senator Burke. S.B. No. 260 was referred to the floor by a vote of 10-3 (Senators O'Brien, Thomas and Williams voting no).

There being no further business to come before the committee, Senator Coley moved that the meeting be adjourned. Senator O'Brien seconded the motion.

Hearing no objections, Chairman Obhof adjourned the meeting.
