Committee on Rules and Reference Minutes
June 10, 2020
133rd General Assembly

Chairman Obhof called the meeting to order.
Attendance was taken. A quorum was present.

The Chair called for a motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. Senator Williams moved that the minutes be accepted without changes or corrections. Senator Wilson seconded the motion. Hearing no objections, the minutes were accepted as written.

The first order of business was the Advise and Consent report of appointments by the Governor. Senator Eklund moved that the report be referred to the floor. Senator Yuko seconded the motion. The report was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0 and the report was properly signed.

The second order of business was the Reference Report for Wednesday, June 10, 2020. Senator Dolan moved that the report be referred to the floor. Senator Burke seconded the motion. The report was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0 and the report was properly signed.

The third order of business was the calendar for Wednesday, June 10, 2020:

The Chair called up H.B. No. 11 (Manning, G/Howse) - Regards tobacco cessation and prenatal initiatives.

Senator Kunze moved H.B. No. 11, seconded by Senator Thomas. H.B. No. 11 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up H.B. No. 61 (Lanese/Liston) - Exempt certain health provider personal info from public records.

Senator Eklund moved H.B. No. 61, seconded by Senator Dolan. H.B. No. 61 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up H.B. No. 65 (Carfagna) - Regards parental notice of risks to children receiving child care.

Senator O'Brien moved H.B. No. 65, seconded by Senator Wilson. H.B. No. 65 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up H.B. No. 160 (Ingram) - Revise alcoholic ice cream law.

The Chair called up H.B. No. 164 (Ginter) - Regards student religious expression.

The Chair called up H.B. No. 341 (Ginter) - Regards administering addiction treatment drugs.

The Chair called up H.B. No. 481 (Fraizer) - Authorize conveyance of state-owned real property.
Senator Dolan moved H.B. No. 481, seconded by Senator Kunze. H.B. No. 481 was referred to the

floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up S.C.R. No. 6 (Burke) - Urge Congress to prohibit robocalls and call spoofing. Senator Williams moved S.C.R. No. 6, seconded by Senator O'Brien. S.C.R. No. 6 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up S.J.R. No. 4 (Peterson) - Issue bonds to repay unemployment compensation advances.

Senator Wilson moved S.J.R. No. 4, seconded by Senator O'Brien. S.J.R. No. 4 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up S.B. No. 272 (Roegner/Blessing) - Enter into the Physical Therapy Licensure Compact.

Senator Dolan moved S.B. No. 272, seconded by Senator Eklund. S.B. No. 272 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up S.B. No. 280 (Blessing) - Exempt credit services/buyer contracts from time to perform.

Senator Burke moved S.B. No. 280, seconded by Senator Yuko. S.B. No. 280 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up S.B. No. 293 (Manning/Blessing) - Create Court of Claims procedure for Open Meetings violations.

Senator Thomas moved S.B. No. 293, seconded by Senator Yuko. S.B. No. 293 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.

The Chair called up S.B. No. 318 (Kunze/Williams) - Extends Women's Suffrage Centennial Commission.

Senator O'Brien moved S.B. No. 318, seconded by Senator Kunze. S.B. No. 318 was referred to the floor by a vote of 14-0.
