

OHIO SENATE
Committee on Transportation, Commerce and Workforce Minutes
March 19, 2019
133rd General Assembly

The Senate Committee on Transportation, Commerce, and Workforce was called to order pursuant to the meeting notice at approximately 10:05a.m. in the Finance Hearing Room of the Statehouse.

Attendance was taken. A quorum was present.

The minutes of the March 13, 2019 committee meeting were approved.

The Chair called up Sub. H.B. 62 for its second formal hearing.

Senator Hottinger moved that a substitute bill (133_LB_0002_7) be accepted by the committee. Senator Uecker seconded the motion. The motion was agreed to without objection.

The Chair called on William Murdock from the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission, to testify on House Bill 62 (written testimony).

The Chair called on Robin Richter from the Ohio Association of Senior Centers to testify on House Bill 62 (written testimony).

The Chair called a Mayor's panel to testify on House Bill 62. Testifiers included Keary McCarthy from the Ohio Mayor's Alliance (written testimony), Mayor Chase Ritenauer from the City of Lorain (written testimony only), Ken Scarrett from Ohio Municipal League (written testimony), Mayor Mike Barhorst from the City of Sidney (written testimony), and Mayor William Flaute of Riverside (written testimony).

The Chair called Matthew Szollosi from the Affiliated Construction Trades Ohio Foundation to testify on House Bill 62 (written testimony).

The Chair recognized written testimony from the following individuals: Holly Gross from the Chamber of Commerce, City Manager Shelly Dickstein of Dayton, Mayor Larry Mulligan of Middletown, Mark Totman from I.U.O.E Local 18, Mayor Donald Patterson of the City of Kettering, Jeannette Wierzbicki from Ohio Mid-Eastern Governments Association, Niki Fenchko, Ross Brankatelli, members from the Ohio Rural Development Alliance, and Katherine Hunt Thomas of the Ability Center of Greater Toledo.

This concluded the second formal hearing of House Bill 62.
