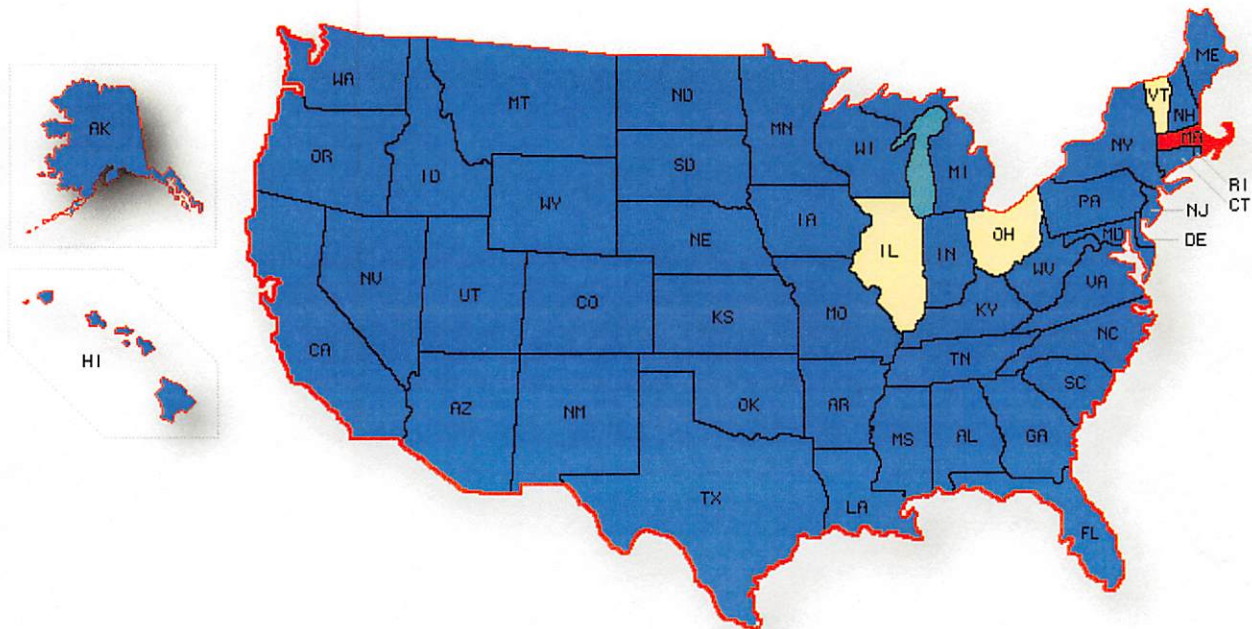




2018 State Fireworks Control Laws
