## Introduction

This memorandum compares licensing requirements applicable to certain environmental professionals in Ohio, Illinois, Indiana, and Pennsylvania.

Ohio's Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) exercises general supervision over the treatment and disposal of sewage and industrial wastes, as well as the operation of water supply works. It does so, in part, by certifying the following: five types of public water system professional operators (A, I, II, III, and IV certification), two types of water distribution professional operators (I and II certification), five types of treatment works professional operators (A, I, II, III, and IV certification), and two types of sewage system professional operators (I and II certification).

OEPA also certifies professionals under the Voluntary Action Program. The Voluntary Action Program allows a person to investigate possible environmental contamination and remediate it, if necessary. OEPA-certified professionals are responsible for verifying that properties are cleaned pursuant to the Program's requirements and may issue no-further-action letters. Illinois, Indiana, and Pennsylvania do not certify professionals in this manner.

Additionally, OEPA has the authority to certify water quality professionals who prepare Section 401 Water Quality Certifications and engineers who conduct compliance reviews under environmental laws. OEPA has not yet formally adopted rules establishing either program. Thus, comparisons with other states are not possible regarding these two certifications.

Finally, the memorandum compares the licensing requirements applicable to professionals implementing requirements associated with motor vehicle inspection and maintenance programs.

## Drinking water and wastewater operator certification

Below is a list of Ohio licenses pertaining to drinking water and wastewater, followed by lists of licenses issued by Indiana, Illinois, and Pennsylvania. Each state licensing scheme is different. Therefore, it is difficult to determine how the licenses from each state align with one another. As a result, the charts are organized by state rather than by license.
