## A BILL

То	establish the STEM Public-Private Partnership	1
	Pilot Program to provide high school students	2
	the opportunity to receive education in a	3
	targeted industry while simultaneously earning	4
	high school and college credit and to make an	5
	appropriation.	6

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) The STEM Public-Private Partnership Pilot	7
Program is hereby created. The program shall operate for fiscal	8
years 2016 and 2017 to encourage public-private partnerships	9
between high schools, colleges, and the community to provide	10
high school students the opportunity to receive education and	11
training in a targeted industry, as defined by JobsOhio	12
established under section 187.01 of the Revised Code, while	13
simultaneously earning high school and college credit for the	14
course. The Chancellor of the Ohio Board of Regents shall	15
administer the program and select five partnerships, one from	16
each quadrant of the state and one from the central part of the	17
state, each to receive a one-time grant of \$400,000.	18

(B) The Chancellor shall adopt rules for the	19
implementation of the STEM Public-Private Partnership Pilot	20
Program, including the requirements for applying for program	21
approval. The rules also shall include, but not be limited to,	22
all of the following operational requirements for the program:	23
(1) Partnerships shall consist of one community college or	24
state community college, one or more private companies, and one	25
or more high schools, either public or private.	26
(2) For purposes of the program, the partnering community	27
college or state community college shall pursue one targeted	28
industry during the pilot period. However, the college may	29
partner with multiple private companies within that industry.	30
(3) Students that take courses offered under the program	31
shall earn college credit for that class from the community or	32
state community college.	33
(4) Students, high schools, and colleges that participate	34
in this program shall do so under the College Credit Plus	35
Program established under Chapter 3365. of the Revised Code.	36
(5) The curriculum offered by the program shall be	37
developed by and agreed upon by all members of the partnership.	38
(6) The private company or companies that are part of the	39
partnership shall provide full- or part-time facilities to be	40
used as classroom space.	41
(C) The Chancellor shall develop an application and review	42
process to select the five partnerships to receive grants under	43
the program. The community college or state community college	44
shall be responsible for submitting the application for the	45
partnership to the Chancellor. The application shall include a	46
proposed budget for the program.	47

(D) The Chancellor shall select the five partnerships for	48
the program based on the following considerations:	49
(1) Whether the partnership existed before the application	50
was submitted;	51
(2) Whether the program is oriented toward a targeted	52
industry;	53
(3) The likelihood of a student gaining employment upon	54
graduating from high school or upon completing a two-year degree	55
in the industry to which the program is oriented in relation to	56
its geographic region;	57
(4) The number of students projected to be served;	58
(5) The program's cost-per-student;	59
(6) The sustainability of the program beyond the duration	60
of the two-year pilot program;	61
(7) The level of investment made by the private company	62
partner or partners in the program, including use of facilities,	63
equipment, and staff and financially.	64
(E) The partnerships selected may use the grants awarded	65
under this section for only the following:	66
(1) Transportation;	67
(2) Classroom supplies, including, but not limited to,	68
textbooks, furniture, and technology;	69
(3) Primary instructors for a course offered under the	70
program, including, but not limited to, faculty from	71
participating high schools and community colleges or state	72
community colleges, including adjunct faculty.	73
