(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 33 pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 34 cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 35 programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 36 cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 37 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 38 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 39 other abortion-related activities. 40

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar41receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the42organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall43

deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that44organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend45the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same46manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends47other money in that fund.48

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 66 receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 67 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 68 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 69 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 70

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar71receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to72

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar99receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the100university or college whose name or marking or design appears on101

collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that102section. A university or college that receives contributions103from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general104scholarship fund.105

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 106 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 107 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 108 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 109 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 110 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 111 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 112

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 114 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 115 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 116 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 117

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar118receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the119Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the120contributions only to promote and support the football team of121Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.122

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 123 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 124 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 125 four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 126 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 127 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 128 sponsors within this state. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 144 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 145 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 146 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 147 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 148 149 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 150 151 the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 153 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 154 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 155 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 156 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 157 personnel, veterans, and their families. 158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar159receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the160

disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 161 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 162 families. 163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 164 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 165 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 166 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 167 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 168 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 169 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 170 destination. 171

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The 181 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 182 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 183 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 184 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 185 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 186 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 187

Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 194 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 195 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 196 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 197 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 198 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 199 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 200 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 201 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 202 under this section. 203

The special bank account shall be separate and 217 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 218 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 219 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 220
