INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 95-Representative DeVitis.

To amend sections 1753.07, 1753.09, 3901.21, 3963.01, 3963.02, and 3963.03 of the Revised Code to prohibit a health insurer from establishing a fee schedule for dental providers for services that are not covered by any contract or participating provider agreement between the health insurer and the dental provider.

H. B. No. 96-Representatives Pelanda, Bishoff.

To amend sections 4723.07 and 4723.48 and to enact section 4723.489 of the Revised Code to authorize a person not otherwise authorized to do so to administer certain drugs pursuant to delegation by an advanced practice registered nurse who holds a certificate to prescribe.

To enact section 5511.10 of the Revised Code to require all signs that indicate an area that is part of the National Park System and are erected on

highways that are part of the state highway system to bear the arrowhead symbol of the National Park Service next to the name of the area.

"Section 203. __. FUNDING FOR BRIDGE REPAIR

The Director of Budget and Management, at the request of the Director of Transportation, shall transfer \$50,000,000 cash in each fiscal year of the biennium ending June 30, 2017, from the Budget Stabilization Fund (Fund 7013) to the Highway Operating Fund (Fund 7002). The transferred cash shall be used to pay costs of bridge repairs and maintenance in the state, and shall be expended on bridges maintained either by political subdivisions or the Department of Transportation. The amounts transferred are hereby appropriated."

Representative Ramos moved to amend, amendment 0196, as follows:

Between lines 5802 and 5803, insert:

"Section 203. __. URBAN TRANSIT SYSTEM FUNDING

(A) On July 1, 2015, or as soon as possible thereafter, the Director of Transportation shall certify to the Director of Budget and Management \$9,450,000 in the Highway Operating Fund (Fund 7002) to be used for additional financial assistance to eligible urban transit systems in the state. This funding to be certified shall be supplemental to the annual formula funding allocations that urban transit systems receive from the Department of Transportation under the Urban Transit Program. Upon certification by the Director of Budget and Management, in FY 2016 the Director of Transportation shall provide grants distributing the certified funding to eligible urban transit systems in the state.

(B) Under this section, all eligible urban transit systems in the state shall receive an equal amount of grant funding, such that no urban transit system shall receive a grant exceeding \$350,000.

(C) For the purposes of this section, an "eligible urban transit system" is defined as a Category I, II, III, IV or V urban transit system identified by the Department of Transportation according to the FY 2015 criteria for Urban Transit Program funding.
