Hall of the House of Representatives, Columbus, Ohio Monday, April 13, 2015, 9:00 o'clock a.m.

The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Duffey was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 148 - Representatives Patterson, LaTourette.

To enact section 3318.75 of the Revised Code to require the Ohio School Facilities Commission to provide classroom facilities assistance to a school district resulting from the consolidation of two or more school districts or from the voluntary transfer of the entire territory of a school district if specified conditions are satisfied.

H. B. No. 149 - Representatives Dever, Patterson.

Cosponsors: Representatives Blessing, Hambley, Kraus, Manning.

To amend sections 4112.02, 4112.05, 4112.08, and 4112.14 and to enact section 4112.024 of the Revised Code to make permissive actual damages and attorney's fees, to limit certain civil penalties, to allow respondents to recover attorney's fees in certain instances, and to exempt certain landlords from the housing provisions of the Ohio Civil Rights Law.

H. B. No. 150 - Representatives Grossman, Scherer.

Cosponsors: Representatives Boose, Perales, Stinziano, Burkley, Lepore-Hagan, Kraus, Sprague, Sheehy, Phillips.

To amend sections 351.021, 353.06, 5739.01, 5739.09, 5739.12, 5739.13, 5741.01, 5741.12, and 5741.13 and to enact section 5739.081 of the Revised Code to require hotel intermediaries to collect and remit applicable sales and use tax on the full amount paid for hotel lodging, to require hotel intermediaries to supply customers with itemized invoices, to specify that a hotel intermediary is presumed to have "substantial nexus" with Ohio if the intermediary arranges lodging at Ohio hotels, and to specify that hotels are not liable for the failure of a hotel intermediary to properly collect or remit applicable taxes.

H. B. No. 151 - Representative Anielski.

Cosponsors: Representatives Grossman, LaTourette, Kraus, Dever, Blessing, Rogers, Brown.

To amend sections 2903.13, 2903.211, 2913.02, and 2917.21 of the Revised Code to expand the offenses of menacing by stalking and telecommunications harassment, to prohibit a person from knowingly causing another person to believe that the offender will cause physical harm or mental distress to a family or household member of the other person, to increase the penalty for assault when the victim is a volunteer firefighter, and to correct a cross reference in the theft statute to special purchase articles.

H. B. No. 152 - Representatives Hood, Brinkman.

Cosponsors: Representatives Retherford, Thompson, Becker, Vitale, Brenner, Blessing, Maag, Roegner, Young, Buchy, Johnson, T., Boose, Kraus, Antani, Amstutz, Hill, Schaffer, Koehler, Zeltwanger, Conditt.

To amend sections 109.69, 109.731, 1547.69, 2923.11, 2923.12, 2923.121, 2923.122, 2923.123, 2923.124, 2923.125, 2923.126, 2923.128, 2923.129, 2923.1213, 2923.16, and 4749.10 and to enact section 2923.111 of the Revised Code to allow a person who has a concealed handgun license to carry concealed all firearms other than dangerous ordnance or firearms that state or federal law prohibits the person from possessing and to provide that a person 21 years of age or older and not legally prohibited from possessing or receiving a firearm by federal law does not need a concealed handgun license in order to carry or have concealed on the person's person or ready at hand a firearm and is subject to the same laws regarding carrying a concealed firearm as a person who has a concealed handgun license.

H. B. No. 153 - Representative Dovilla.

To amend sections 3501.01, 3513.01, and 3513.12 of the Revised Code to change the date on which presidential primary elections are held.

H. B. No. 154 - Representatives Henne, Sheehy.

Cosponsors: Representatives Stinziano, Grossman, Clyde, Perales, Duffey, Zeltwanger, Smith, K., Brenner, Lepore-Hagan, Fedor.

To amend sections 4511.132 and 4511.27 of the Revised Code to provide that when a motor vehicle passes a bicycle the safe passing distance to the left is three feet, and to alter the protocol for proceeding into an intersection that has malfunctioning traffic lights.

Said bills were considered the first time.
