The House met pursuant to adjournment.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

**INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

The following bills were introduced:

**H. B. No. 354** - Representative Kuhns.

Cosponsors: Representatives Reece, Driehaus.

To enact section 5.256 of the Revised Code to designate the third day of October as Ezzard Charles Day.

**H. B. No. 355** - Representative Retherford.

Cosponsors: Representatives Maag, Young, Blessing, Henne, Cera, O'Brien, S.

To amend sections 1349.61, 4121.01, 4123.01, 4123.026, 4141.01, and 5747.01 and to enact sections 4175.01, 4175.02, 4175.03, 4175.04, 4175.05, 4175.06, 4175.061, 4175.07, and 4175.99 of the Revised Code to create a generally uniform definition of employee for specified labor laws and to prohibit employee misclassification under those laws.

**H. B. No. 356** - Representatives Celebrezze, Johnson, G.

Cosponsors: Representatives Slesnick, Lepore-Hagan, Bishoff.

To amend sections 109.921, 3701.046, 3727.60, and 5101.55 and to repeal sections 9.04, 3701.511, 5101.56, and 5101.57 of the Revised Code to permit using state resources to provide abortion care.

**H. B. No. 357** - Representatives Johnson, G., Smith, K.

Cosponsors: Representatives Slesnick, Howse, Lepore-Hagan, Fedor, Bishoff, Celebrezze.

To amend sections 2317.56, 2919.12, and 2919.192 and to repeal section 2919.122 of the Revised Code to remove waiting-period restrictions on when a woman can obtain an abortion and to repeal requirements governing the provision of notice to a woman's relative, custodian, or guardian, if the woman is seeking an abortion and is pregnant, unmarried, a minor, and unemancipated.

**H. B. No. 358** - Representatives Dever, Conditt.

To amend section 5747.01 and to enact section 5747.78 of the Revised Code to allow an income tax deduction for contributions to ABLE savings

accounts.

**H. B. No. 359** - Representatives Duffey, Gonzales.

Cosponsors: Representatives Bishoff, Anielski, Hall, LaTourette, Perales, Stinziano, Antani, Grossman, Sears, Scherer, Sprague, Patmon.

To amend sections 149.43, 2929.18, 2929.28, 3503.13, 3503.16, 3503.21, 3503.23, 3503.24, 3503.26, 3504.02, 3504.04, 3505.181, 3505.182, 3505.183, 3509.03, 3509.04, 3509.05, 3509.06, 3509.07, 3509.09, 3511.02, 3511.05, 3511.11, and 3511.12 and to enact sections 111.41, 111.42, 111.43, 111.44, 111.45, 111.46, 111.47, 111.48, and 111.99 of the Revised Code to create an address confidentiality program for victims of domestic violence, menacing by stalking, human trafficking, trafficking in persons, rape, sexual battery, and other crimes.

Said bills were considered the first time.
