INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 477 - Representatives Howse, Smith, K.

Cosponsors: Representatives Strahorn, Sykes, Leland, Lepore-Hagan, Johnson, G., Cera, Kuhns, Celebrezze, Driehaus, Sweeney, Boccieri, Ramos, Antonio, Phillips, Slesnick, Craig, Boyce, Reece, Ashford, Boyd.

To enact section 5534.56 of the Revised Code to designate the planned boulevard known as the Opportunity Corridor within Cleveland as the "Congressman Louis Stokes Opportunity Corridor."

H. B. No. 478 - Representative Johnson, G.

Cosponsors: Representatives Antonio, Boccieri, Boyce, Clyde, Howse, Leland, Lepore-Hagan, O'Brien, M., Phillips, Ramos, Sheehy, Smith, K., Sweeney.

To amend sections 2929.13, 2929.14, 2929.22, 2929.24, and 2971.03 of the Revised Code to authorize a court that sentences an offender for a felony to a prison term or term of local incarceration, or for a misdemeanor to a jail term, to impose in the sentence, in addition to the term, an order that prohibits the offender from having direct or indirect contact with any person as specified by the court and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 479 - Representative Antonio.

To enact section 5534.51 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 2 in Cuyahoga County as the "Governor Richard F. Celeste Shoreway."

H. B. No. 480 - Representative Green.

Cosponsors: Representatives Boose, Becker, Thompson.

To amend sections 1533.61 and 1533.99 of the Revised Code to require persons authorized under existing law to possess gill nets for specified

purposes to obtain annual licenses and serial numbered tags for the gill nets, to authorize a holder of an aquaculture permit to possess and use a gill net in accordance with such a license and tag, to specify a criminal penalty applicable to a person who fails to properly possess a gill net, and to make other changes governing the possession of nets, traps, or other devices for catching fish under the Hunting and Fishing Law.

H. B. No. 481 - Representatives Thompson, Koehler.

Cosponsors: Representatives Becker, Hood, Zeltwanger.

To amend Sections 4 and 5 of Am. Sub. H.B. 7 of the 131st General Assembly to revise the requirements regarding student enrollment reporting for public schools, mandatory student withdrawal policies, and scholarship program eligibility relative to students who choose not to take state assessments during the 2015-2016 school year and to declare an emergency.

Said bills were considered the first time.
