The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Representative Brenner was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills and joint resolution were introduced:

H. B. No. 484 - Representatives Sykes, Cera.

Cosponsors: Representatives Johnson, G., Howse, Boyce, Fedor, O'Brien, M., Sheehy, Phillips, Smith, K., Kuhns, Antonio, Rogers, Ramos, Patterson, Leland, O'Brien, S., Lepore-Hagan, Celebrezze.

To amend sections 131.51 and 5739.02 and to enact sections 130.40, 5739.212, and 5741.033 of the Revised Code to exempt from sales and use tax the sale of nonprescription human drugs, feminine hygiene products associated with menstruation, and disposable baby diapers, to reimburse the Local Government Fund and Public Library Fund and county and transit sales and use tax collections for any revenue lost due to those exemptions, and to create the Legislative Commission on Middle Class Economic Strength to study proposed income, sales, or use tax legislation that changes the proportionate tax burden among income classes or other classes.

H. B. No. 485 - Representative Ramos.

Cosponsors: Representatives Hood, Patterson, Clyde, Bocchieri, Antonio, Cera, Smith, K., Boyce, Lepore-Hagan, Leland.

To amend section 5747.01 of the Revised Code to reinstate the state income tax deduction for qualified higher education tuition and fee payments that expired December 31, 2005.

H. B. No. 486 - Representatives Smith, K., Craig.

Cosponsors: Representatives Sykes, Antonio, Boyce, Lepore-Hagan, Boyd, O'Brien, M., Patterson, Curtin, Strahorn, Leland, Boggs, Sheehy.

To amend sections 4111.02, 4111.09, and 4111.14 and to repeal section 4111.07 of the Revised Code to increase the state minimum wage to ten dollars and ten cents per hour beginning January 1, 2017.

H. B. No. 487 - Representatives LaTourette, Roegner.

Cosponsors: Representatives Blessing, Bocchieri, Ginter, Perales, Smith, K.

To amend section 3313.618 and to enact section 3313.6111 of the Revised Code to require the State Board of Education to establish the state Seal of Biliteracy to be attached or affixed to the high school transcripts of qualifying students.

H. B. No. 488 - Representative Sprague.

Cosponsors: Representatives Becker, Perales, Terhar.

To amend sections 2305.234, 2305.2341, and 3701.071 and to enact sections 3701.074 and 4745.04 of the Revised Code to modify the qualified immunity from civil liability for volunteer health care services provided to indigent and uninsured persons and to permit health care professionals to earn continuing education credit by providing volunteer health care services to indigent and uninsured persons.

H. J. R. No. 7 - Representatives Sheehy, Ramos.

Cosponsor: Representative Lepore-Hagan.

To urge the United States Congress and the President of the United States to enact legislation that would reinstate the separation of commercial and investment banking function that was in effect under the Glass-Steagall Act.

Said bills and joint resolution were considered the first time.
