The House met pursuant to adjournment.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 494 - Representatives Antonio, Boyd. Cosponsors: Representatives Strahorn, Celebrezze, Sykes, Howse, Lepore-Hagan, Slesnick, Fedor, Johnson, G., Clyde.

To amend sections 2151.34, 2903.13, 2903.21, 2903.214, 2919.25, 2919.26, 2923.13, and 3113.31 and to enact section 2923.132 of the Revised Code to require a court that issues a protection order to determine if the respondent is prohibited from carrying or possessing a firearm, to require a court to determine whether an offender who has been convicted of specified offenses is prohibited from carrying or possessing a firearm, and to require a respondent or offender who the court determines is prohibited from carrying or possessing a firearm, and to require a respondent or offender who the court determines is prohibited from carrying or possessing a firearm to transfer all firearms in the person's possession to a law enforcement agency or a federally licensed firearms dealer.

H. B. No. 495 - Representative Hayes.

To amend sections 1901.01, 1901.02, 1901.03, 1901.07, 1901.08, 1901.31, 1901.312, 1901.34, and 1907.11 of the Revised Code to create the Perry County Municipal Court in New Lexington on January 1, 2017, to establish one full-time judgeship in that court, to provide for the nomination of the judge by petition only, to abolish the Perry County County Court on that date, to designate the Perry County Clerk of Courts as the clerk of the Perry County Municipal Court, and to provide for the election for the Perry County Municipal Court of one full-time judge in 2017.

H. B. No. 496 - Representative Boccieri.

Cosponsors: Representatives Lepore-Hagan, Arndt, Terhar, Leland, Phillips, Sweeney, Rogers, Celebrezze, Strahorn, Patterson, Johnson, G., Ashford, Perales, Cera, O'Brien, M., Sheehy.

To amend sections 3314.03, 3326.11, and 3328.24 and to enact sections 3313.5315 and 3345.425 of the Revised Code to enact the "Student to Soldiers Support Act (S3A)" regarding the participation of students who are serving in the uniformed services in extracurricular activities at public and nonpublic schools and public and private colleges.

H. B. No. 497 - Representatives Brenner, Huffman. Cosponsors: Representatives Fedor, Rezabek, Hood, Thompson, Hambley, Koehler, Arndt, Sprague, Grossman.

To amend sections 2929.16 and 2929.26 and to enact sections 341.43, 753.34, and 5145.33 of the Revised Code to establish a statewide pilot program for the provision of long-acting opioid antagonist therapy for offenders confined in a state or local correctional facility or a community residential facility under a sentence imposed for a felony opioid-related offense or a sentence of at least 30 days for a misdemeanor opioid-related offense who will be released on supervised release, and to specify that the therapy is to be provided during both their confinement and their supervised release.

H. B. No. 498 - Representative Kunze.

To amend sections 3313.66 and 3313.661 and to enact section 3313.668 of the Revised Code with respect to the expulsion of a student from a school district, community school, or STEM school for communicating a threat of violence to occur on school grounds.

H. B. No. 499 - Representatives Grossman, Schuring. Cosponsors: Representatives Blessing, Slesnick, Sweeney, Perales, Green, Brenner, Sprague.

To amend section 3701.571 and to enact sections 3701.90 and 3701.901 of the Revised Code to establish the Ohio Parkinson's Disease and Movement Disorder Registry.

H. B. No. 500 - Representative Arndt.

Cosponsors: Representatives Schuring, Boose, Cupp, Romanchuk, Young, Sprague, Brenner.

To amend Sections 257.10, 257.30, and 305.190 of Am. Sub. H.B. 64 of the 131st General Assembly to revise the Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program, to establish a case management pilot program, to transfer cash from the Economic Development Program Fund (Fund 5JC0) to the Case Management Pilot Program Fund (Fund 5SK0), and to make an appropriation.

H. B. No. 501 - Representatives Dovilla, Anielski.

Cosponsors: Representatives Arndt, Baker, Barnes, Blessing, DeVitis, Hagan, Howse, Patmon.

To support the Youth STEM Commercialization and Entrepreneurship Program and to make an appropriation.
