BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, The growth and abuse of federal regulatory authority threaten our constitutional liberties, including those guaranteed by the Bill of Rights in the First, Second, Fourth, and Fifth Amendments to the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Federal regulators must be more accountable to elected representatives of the people and not immune from such accountability; and

WHEREAS, The United States House of Representatives has11passed with bipartisan support the Regulations from the12Executive in Need of Scrutiny (REINS) Act to require that13Congress approve major new federal regulations before they may14take effect; and15

WHEREAS, Even if enacted, a law may be repealed or waived16by a future Congress or President; and17

WHEREAS, An amendment to the Constitution of the United

to the President their written declaration of opposition to a	27
