ARESOLUTION

To urge the Congress of the United States, and in	1
particular the Ohio Congressional delegation, to	2
vote against Fast Track Legislation.	3

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, It is the duty of Congress, under Article I,	4
Section 8 of the United States Constitution, to regulate	5
commerce with foreign nations to the benefit of the United	6
States; and	7
WHEREAS, Under Fast Track Legislation, also known as Trade	8
Promotion Authority, Congress abdicates its right to amend or	9
significantly debate trade agreements, allowing only a "yes" or	10
"no" vote, with no possibility of improvement for American	11
companies or American workers; and	12
WHEREAS, No trade agreement has ever been defeated under	13
Fast Track Rules; and	14
WHEREAS, Trade agreements under Fast Track Rules are	15
negotiated in secret, with no input from the public; and	16
WHEREAS, The United States trade agreements that have been	17

enacted under Fast Track Rules--including the North American18Free Trade Agreement, the Central America Free Trade19Agreement, and the Korean-US Free Trade Agreement--have20resulted in sixty thousand manufacturing facilities closing21in the United States and the loss of over seven million22manufacturing jobs; and23

WHEREAS, Ohio has lost 100,000 manufacturing jobs to overseas factories, ranking eighth in the nation; and

WHEREAS, Previous trade agreements enacted under Fast26Track Rules have "lose to win" enforcement mechanisms, i.e.,27the United States has to lose jobs in order to win a ruling28enforcing the trade agreement if it is violated by another29party; and30

WHEREAS, The job losses attributable to trade agreements31enacted under Fast Track Rules have impacted states and local32communities through smaller tax bases and lost revenue; now33therefore be it34

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the House of35Representatives of the 131st General Assembly of the State of36Ohio, on behalf of all citizens of this state, urge the37Congress of the United States, and in particular the Ohio38Congressional delegation, to vote against Fast Track39Legislation; and be it further40

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives 41 transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the 42 President of the United States, the President Pro Tempore and 43 Secretary of the United States Senate, the Speaker and Clerk 44 of the United States House of Representatives, each member of 45 the Ohio Congressional delegation, and the news media of 46 Ohio. 47
