## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, In 2013, women who were employed as full-time and	4			
year-round workers in the United States earned 78% of the wages	5			
that men earned during that time; and	6			
WHEREAS, Race and ethnicity affect women's earnings, and in	7			
2013, African American women earned 64% and Hispanic and Latina	8			
women earned 54% of the wages earned by nonHispanic white men				
during that time; and				
WHEREAS, Mothers are the primary or sole source of income	11			
in nearly 40% of families, and married mothers are the primary	12			
or sole source of income for nearly two-thirds of families; and	13			
WHEREAS, About 7% of the gap between women's and men's	14			
earnings cannot be explained by hours worked, occupation,				
college major, employment sector, or other factors related to				
pay; and

WHEREAS, It will take 43 years, until 2058, for men and	18			
women to reach parity in pay if the pace of change in the	19			
annual earnings ratio continues at the same rate as it has	20			
since 1960; and	21			
WHEREAS, In Ohio, women who are employed as full-time	22			
and year-round workers earn 77% of the wages that men in the	23			
state earn; and	24			
WHEREAS, Almost 18% of women in Ohio fall below the	25			
poverty line, including 36% of family households that are	26			
headed by women; and	27			
WHEREAS, The Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act clarified	28			
federal law that a discriminatory compensation decision	29			
occurs each time an employee is paid pursuant to a previous				
discriminatory compensation decision; and	31			
WHEREAS, Equal Pay Day is recognized on a Tuesday to	32			
illustrate how far beyond the previous work week women must	33			
work to have earned the same amount of pay as men during that	34			
time; now therefore be it	35
