To urge Congress to enact legislation denying firearms

REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING):	
WHEREAS, Terrorism in all forms and manifestations	3
constitutes one of the most serious threats to peace and	4
security and any acts of terrorism are criminal and	5
unjustifiable regardless of their motivations, whenever,	6
wherever, and by whomsoever committed; and	7
WHEREAS, Terrorism poses a threat to national peace and	8
security and countering this threat requires collective efforts	9
on national and state levels; and	10
WHEREAS, A person who had been investigated by the Federal	11
Bureau of Investigation on two separate occasions in the past	12
three years and had previously been listed on a United States	13
terrorist watch list for potential terrorist activities legally	14
purchased and obtained one semiautomatic pistol and one	15
semiautomatic rifle; and	16
WHEREAS, The aforementioned individual used his legally	17
obtained firearms, one week after purchase, to commit the	18
deadliest mass shooting in recent United States history, killing	19
forty-nine people and wounding fifty-three others; and	20

WHEREAS, No current federal law prohibits individuals	21
currently or previously under investigation by the Federal	22
Bureau of Investigation from legally purchasing a firearm; and	23
WHEREAS, No current federal law prohibits individuals who	24
are on a United States terrorist watch list from legally	25
purchasing a firearm; and	26
WHEREAS, Ohio Governor John Kasich has publicly stated that	27
individuals suspected of terrorist activity should be legally	28
prohibited from purchasing firearms; and	29
WHEREAS, There is bipartisan support from leaders	30
throughout Ohio and throughout the entire United States in favor	31
of prohibiting terrorism suspects from legally purchasing	32
firearms; and	33
WHEREAS, A recent Quinnipiac University poll found that	34
eighty-three per cent of Americans, including seventy-seven per	35
cent of Republicans, eighty-nine per cent of Democrats, and	36
eighty-five per cent of Independents support legally prohibiting	37
terrorism suspects from purchasing firearms; and	38
WHEREAS, The "Denying Firearms and Explosives to Dangerous	39
Terrorists Act of 2015" has been introduced in the United States	40
Congress and would grant the United States Attorney General the	41
authority to deny the transfer of firearms or the issuance of a	42
federal firearms and explosives license to any individual if the	43
Attorney General determines that such individual has been	44
engaged in or has provided material support or resources for	45
terrorist activities and the Attorney General has a reasonable	46
belief that such individual may use a firearm or explosive in	47
connection with terrorism; and	48
WHEREAS, The "Denying Firearms and Explosives to Dangerous	49
Terrorists Act of 2015" has failed to pass the United States	50
Senate despite bipartisan support and its ability to prevent	51
