CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge the Congress of the United States	to disapprove 1
the Iranian nuclear agreement known as	the Joint 2
Comprehensive Plan of Action.	3

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, The threat posed by a nuclear-armed Iran has	4
concerned western powers ever since the 1979 Islamic Revolution;	5
and	6
WHEREAS, The International Atomic Energy Agency has	7
consistently stated that it is unable to conclude that Iran's	8
nuclear program is entirely peaceful; and	9
WHEREAS, The Islamic Republic of Iran has long supported	10
the terrorist organizations of Hezbollah, Hamas, and Palestine	11
Islamic Jihad; and	12
WHEREAS, For decades, the United States and other nations	13
have imposed economic sanctions targeting investments in Iran;	14
and	15
WHEREAS, Despite consistent opposition by members of	16
Congress, the United States has participated in formal	17
negotiations with the Islamic Republic of Iran intending to	18

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develop a framework to prevent Iran from developing nuclear weapon capabilities in exchange for the reduction or elimination of economic sanctions; and

WHEREAS, The negotiations have led to an international agreement on the Iranian nuclear program, which is known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action; and

WHEREAS, The agreement requires the United States, as well as other nations and the European Union, to lift economic sanctions, an action that will infuse the Iranian regime with money to finance global terrorism; and

WHERAS, The agreement does not permanently prevent Iran from developing a nuclear weapon; and

WHEREAS, Page 15 of the agreement stipulates that, "If a law at the state or local level in the United States is preventing the implementation of the sanctions lifting as specified in this JCPOA, the United States will take appropriate steps, taking into account all available authorities, with a view to achieving such implementation. The United States will actively encourage officials at the state or local level to take into account the changes in the U.S. policy reflected in the lifting of sanctions under this JCPOA and to refrain from actions inconsistent with this change in policy."; and

WHEREAS, The Supreme Court of the United States has held that states cannot be forced to comply with nonself-executing international treaties unless Congress has passed statutes giving those treaties effect; and

WHEREAS, Congress is currently reviewing the Joint45Comprehensive Plan of Action and is expected to vote on a46resolution to disapprove the agreement in September 2015; and47

WHEREAS, Implementation of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of48Action is against the security interests of the United States49

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and its allies; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 131st General51Assembly of the State of Ohio, urge the Congress of the United52States to disapprove the Iranian nuclear agreement known as the53Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action; and be it further54

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit duly55authenticated copies of this resolution to the President of the56United States, the President Pro Tempore and Secretary of the57United States Senate, the Speaker and Clerk of the United States58House of Representatives, each member of the Ohio Congressional59delegation, and the news media of Ohio.60

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
