road was started on October 27, 1952, and it was completed in	12
thirty-eight months, opening on October 1, 1955. Serving as a	13

east and west in the northern section of the state, and in 2012,	15
it was traveled by more than 49.8 million vehicles; and	16

and public spirit of our state's citizens. It is through the	19
