A BILL

To amend sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 and to enact 1
section 4503.875 of the Revised Code to create 2
the Walsh Jesuit license plate. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 be amended 4
and section 4503.875 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as 5
follows: 6

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 7
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 8
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 9
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 10
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 11
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.50, 4503.501, 12
4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 4503.521, 4503.522, 13
4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 4503.528, 4503.529, 14
4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 4503.551, 4503.552, 15
4503.553, 4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 4503.561, 4503.562, 16
4503.564, 4503.565, 4503.576, 4503.577, 4503.591, 4503.592, 17
4503.67, 4503.68, 4503.69, 4503.701, 4503.702, 4503.71, 18

4503.711, 4503.712, 4503.713, 4503.715, 4503.72, 4503.722, 19

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 25
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 26

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 27
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 28
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 29
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 30
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 31
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 32
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 33
other abortion-related activities. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 35
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 36
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 37
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 38
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 39
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 40
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 41
other money in that fund. 42

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 43
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 44
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 45
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47

receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 48
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 49
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 50
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 51
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 52
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 53
directly to their clients. 54

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 55
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 56
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 57
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 58
pancreatic cancer and their families. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 60
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 61
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 62
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 63
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 64

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 65
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 66
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 67
its research and other programs. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 70
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 71
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 72

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 73
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 74
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 75
contributions for its research and other programs. 76

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for scholarships and other educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those contributions for scholarships for students who are members of that organization.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the

university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 106
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 107
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 108
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 109
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 110
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 111
funds as provided in this section. 112

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 113
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 114
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 115
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 116
cyclists of all ages. 117

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 118
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 119
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 120
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 121
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 122
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 123
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 126
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 127
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 128
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 131
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 132
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 133
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 134

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 165
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 166
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 167
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 168
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 169
personnel, veterans, and their families. 170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 171
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 172
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 173
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 174
families. 175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 176
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 177
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 178
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 179
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 180
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 181
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 182
destination. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 184
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 185
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 186
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 187
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 188

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 189
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 190
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 191
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 192
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 193
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 194

section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 195
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 196
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 197
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 198
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 199

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 200
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 201
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 204
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 205
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 206
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 207
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 208
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 209
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 210
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 211
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 212
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 213
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 214
under this section. 215

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 216
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 217
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 218
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 219
programs. 220

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 221
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 222
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 223
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 224

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective of the county of residence of an applicant.

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (G) of that section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, which shall use the contributions for the protection and preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in

Ohio and for educational programs.	285
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.	286 287 288 289 290

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 317
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 318
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 319
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 320
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 321
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 322

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 323
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 324
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 325
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 326
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 327
in the line of duty. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 329
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 330
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 331
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 332
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 335
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 336
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 337
families. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 339
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 340
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 341
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 342

Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 343
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 344
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 345
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 346
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 347
participating in that program. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 350
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 351
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 354
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 355
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 356
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 357

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 358
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 359
Siegel & Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 360
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 361
Cleveland, Ohio. 362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 364
Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in 365
whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 366
resides. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 369
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 370
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 371

4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 372
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 375
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 376
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 377
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 378
rotary foundation. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 381
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 382
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 383
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 385
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 386
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 387
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 389
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 390
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 391
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 392
connection. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 395
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 396
research projects. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 399
Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 400

contributions solely to promote and support the historical 401
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 402
state. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 405
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 406
contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 407
baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409
receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 410
Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 411
contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 412
providing services to the school district's students that assist 413
in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 414
of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 415
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 416
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 417
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 418
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 419
superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 420
discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 421
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 422
that the school district hires to provide those services. The 423
school district also may use the contributions it receives to 424
pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 425
training in providing such services to the students of the 426
school district. The school district shall ensure that any 427
charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 428
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 429
Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 430
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St. Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to receive training in providing those services. The school principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable organization is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school shall not use the contributions it receives for any other purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.875 of the Revised Code to Walsh Jesuit high school located in the municipal corporation of Cuyahoga Falls. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and

emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 463
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 464
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 465
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 466
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 467
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 468
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 469
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 470
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 471
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 472
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 473
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 474
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 475
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 478
receives pursuant to section 4503.877 of the Revised Code to the 479
Independence local school district. The school district shall 480
use the contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs 481
in providing services to the school district's students that 482
assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional 483
well-being of the students. The services provided may include 484
bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 485
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 486
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 487
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school 488
district superintendent or, in the school district 489
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 490
appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 491
organizations that the school district hires to provide those 492
services. The school district also may use the contributions it 493

receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 494
district to receive training in providing such services to the 495
students of the school district. The school district shall 496
ensure that any charitable organization that is hired by the 497
district is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 498
501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school district 499
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 500
purpose. 501

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 502
receives pursuant to section 4503.89 of the Revised Code to the 503
American red cross of greater Columbus on behalf of the Ohio 504
chapters of the American red cross, which shall use the 505
contributions for disaster readiness, preparedness, and response 506
programs on a statewide basis. 507

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 508
receives pursuant to section 4503.90 of the Revised Code to the 509
nationwide children's hospital foundation. 510

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 511
receives pursuant to section 4503.901 of the Revised Code to the 512
Ohio association for pupil transportation, which shall use the 513
money to support transportation programs, provide training to 514
school transportation professionals, and support other 515
initiatives for school transportation safety. 516

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 517
receives pursuant to section 4503.902 of the Revised Code to St. 518
Ignatius high school located in the municipal corporation of 519
Cleveland. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 520
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 521
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 522
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 523

students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 524
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 525
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 526
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 527
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 528
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 529
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 530
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 531
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 532
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 533
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 534
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 535
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 536
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 537
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 538
purpose. 539

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 540
receives pursuant to section 4503.903 of the Revised Code to the 541
Brecksville-Broadview Heights city school district. The school 542
district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the 543
expenses it incurs in providing services to the school 544
district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the 545
mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services 546
provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 547
defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 548
counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 549
violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 550
The school district superintendent or, in the school district 551
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 552
appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 553
organizations that the school district hires to provide those 554

services. The school district also may use the contributions it 555
receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 556
district to receive training in providing such services to the 557
students of the school district. The school district shall 558

district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the 567

district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the 569
mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services 570
provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 571
defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 572
counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 573
violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 574
The school district superintendent or, in the school district 575
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 576
appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 577

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 588

shall use those contributions in accordance with its articles of 591
incorporation and for the benefit of servicemembers of the armed 592
forces of the United States and their families when they are in 593
financial need. 594

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 595
receives pursuant to section 4503.94 of the Revised Code to the 596
Michelle's leading star foundation, which shall use the money 597
solely to fund the rental, lease, or purchase of the simulated 598
driving curriculum of the Michelle's leading star foundation by 599
boards of education of city, exempted village, local, and joint 600
vocational school districts. 601

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 602
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 603
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 604
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 605
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 606

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 607
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 608
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 609
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 610
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 611

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 612
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 613
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 614

distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 615
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 616
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 617
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 618
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 619

Sec. 4503.772. (A) Each school or school district for 620
which a license plate is established under section 4503.871, 621
4503.874, 4503.875, 4503.877, 4503.902, 4503.903, or 4503.904 of 622
the Revised Code shall produce an annual report containing all 623
of the following information: 624

(1) The total amount received during the prior year from 625
license plate contributions; 626

(2) An itemized list of each expenditure, and a 627
description of each expenditure, made using funds received from 628
license plate contributions during the prior year; 629

(3) The total percentage of spending that was used to 630
provide services to students to assist in developing and 631
maintaining mental and emotional well-being. 632

(B) (1) Not later than the first day of December of each 633
year, the school or school district shall submit the report to 634
the department of mental health and addiction services and to 635
the registrar of motor vehicles. If a school or school district 636
fails to submit the report by the thirty-first day of December 637
of any year, the registrar shall begin transmitting the 638
contribution for each registration involving the license plate 639
for that school or school district to the treasurer of state for 640
deposit into the general revenue fund, instead of for deposit in 641
the license plate contribution fund created in section 4501.21 642
of the Revised Code. 643

(2) Immediately after receiving a report from a school or 644
school district for which contributions are being diverted under 645
division (B)(1) of this section, the registrar shall resume 646
transmitting the contributions received for that license plate 647
to the treasurer of state for deposit into the license plate 648
contribution fund and for later distribution to the school or 649
school district. 650

Sec. 4503.875. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 651
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, 652
motorcycle, cab-enclosed motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, motor 653
scooter, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar 654
of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the 655
registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Walsh Jesuit High 656
School" license plates. The application for "Walsh Jesuit High 657
School" license plates may be combined with a request for a 658
special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 659
of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application 660
and compliance with division (B) of this section, the registrar 661
shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 662
registration and a set of "Walsh Jesuit High School" license 663
plates with a validation sticker or a validation sticker alone 664
when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 665

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 666
inscribed thereon, "Walsh Jesuit High School" license plates 667
shall bear words and markings selected by Walsh Jesuit high 668
school. The registrar shall approve the final design. "Walsh 669
Jesuit High School" license plates shall bear county 670
identification stickers that identify the county of registration 671
as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 672

(B) "Walsh Jesuit High School" license plates and 673

validation stickers shall be issued upon payment of the regular 674
license tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised 675
Code, any applicable motor vehicle tax levied under Chapter 676
4504. of the Revised Code, a bureau of motor vehicles 677
administrative fee of ten dollars, the contribution specified in 678
division (C) of this section, and compliance with all other 679
applicable laws relating to the registration of motor vehicles. 680
If the application for "Walsh Jesuit High School" license plates 681
is combined with a request for a special reserved license plate 682
under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, the 683
license plates and validation sticker shall be issued upon 684
payment of the contribution, fees, and taxes contained in this 685
division and the additional fee prescribed under section 4503.40 686
or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. 687

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 688
registration renewal submitted under this section, the registrar 689
shall collect a contribution of thirty dollars. The registrar 690
shall pay this contribution into the state treasury to the 691
credit of the license plate contribution fund created in section 692
4501.21 of the Revised Code. 693

(2) The registrar shall pay the ten-dollar bureau 694
administrative fee, the purpose of which is to compensate the 695
bureau for additional services required in issuing "Walsh Jesuit 696
High School" license plates, into the state treasury to the 697
credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created in 698
section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 699

(D) Sections 4503.77 and 4503.78 of the Revised Code do 700
not apply to license plates issued under this section. 701

Section 2. That existing sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 of 702
the Revised Code are hereby repealed. 703
