# A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.905 of the Revised Code to create the	2
"Hudson City Schools" license plate.	3

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.905 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495,	10
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.50, 4503.501,	11
4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 4503.522, 4503.523,	12
4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 4503.528, 4503.529, 4503.531,	13
4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 4503.551, 4503.552, 4503.553,	14
4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 4503.561, 4503.562, 4503.564,	15

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

26 The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 27 cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 28 programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 29 cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 30 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 31 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 32 other abortion-related activities. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received42pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism43society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs44and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.45

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar46receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the47

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national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar68receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to69special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions70for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.71

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar72receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the73children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the74contributions for its research and other programs.75

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 77 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 78 contributions into its general account to be used for 79 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 80 America foundation. 81

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 87 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 88 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 89 scholarships and other educational activities. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those contributions for scholarships for students who are members of that organization.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 96 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 97 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 98 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 99 section. A university or college that receives contributions 100 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 101 scholarship fund. 102

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar103receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the104university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of105

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awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend106the university. The university shall not use more than twenty107per cent of the funds it receives for purposes of administering108the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into109appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to110effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this111section.112

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 114 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 115 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 116 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 117 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 118 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 121 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 122 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 123 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar125receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the126Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the127contributions only to promote and support the football team of128Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar130receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the131United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-132four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron133district shall use the money it receives under this section to134pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or135

sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 138 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 139 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 140 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 141 activities. 142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 144 Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the 145 money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it 146 incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the 147 provision of services to children, young adults, and families in 148 this state. 149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 151 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 1.52 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 153 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 154 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 155 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 156 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 157 the improvement of patient outcomes. 158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 159 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 160 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 161 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 162 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 163 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 164 personnel, veterans, and their families. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 167 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 168 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 169 families. 170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 171 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 172 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 173 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 174 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 175 176 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 177 destination. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 184 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 185 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 186 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 187 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 188 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 189 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 190 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 191 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 192 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 193 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 194

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 195

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receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 196 rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 197 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 198 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 199 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 200 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 201 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 202 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 203 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 204 205 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 206 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 207 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 208 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 209 under this section. 210 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 211 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 212 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 213 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 214 215 programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar216receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the217western reserve historical society, which shall use the218contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.219

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 220 receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 221 Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 222 negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 223 contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 224

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 225 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 226 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 227 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 228 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 229 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 230 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 231 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 232 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 233 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 234 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 235 such payments are to be made. 236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar242receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to243Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute244to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.245

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar250receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the251Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those252contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational253information about beekeeping, and to support other state and254

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local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 256 receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 257 national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 258 contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 259 legends to inspire future leaders. 260

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 261 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 2.62 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 263 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 264 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 265 commission and that is participating in the license plate 266 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 267 of the county of residence of an applicant. 268

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each269contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of270the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates271that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is272participating in the license plate program pursuant to division273(G) of that section.274

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar275receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to276pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program,277which shall use the contributions for the protection and278preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in279Ohio and for educational programs.280

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar281receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the282Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council283

shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 286 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 287 great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 288 America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 289 equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 290 the girl scouts. 291

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 301 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 302 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 303 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 304 charitable purposes. 305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 306 receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 307 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 308 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 309 purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 310

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar311receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the312

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fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 313 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 314 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 315 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 316 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions received318pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio319concerns of police survivors, which shall use those320contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate321to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed322in the line of duty.323

The registrar shall pay the contributions received324pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater325Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those326contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in327the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 330 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 331 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 332 families. 333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 335 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 336 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 337 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 338 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 339 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 340 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 341 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 342

participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344 receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 345 Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 346 contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar348receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to349Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the350contributions into its general account to be used for purposes351of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353 receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 354 Siegel & Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 355 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 356 Cleveland, Ohio. 357

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 364 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 365 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 366 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 367 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar369receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the370rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,371

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Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and	372
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the	373
rotary foundation.	374
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	375
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the	376
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Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the	377
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained	378
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.	379
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	380
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to	381
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the	382
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.	383
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	384
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the	385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 399 receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 400

Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those401contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth402baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 405 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 406 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 407 providing services to the school district's students that assist 408 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 409 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 410 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 411 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 412 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 413 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 414 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 415 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 416 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 417 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 418 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 419 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 420 training in providing such services to the students of the 421 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 422 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 423 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 424 Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 425 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 426

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar427receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St.428Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of429Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the430contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its431

students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 432 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 433 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 434 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 435 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 436 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 4.37 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 438 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 439 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 440 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 441 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 442 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 443 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 444 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 445 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 446 subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 447 shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 448 purpose. 449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 450 receives pursuant to section 4503.877 of the Revised Code to the 451 Independence local school district. The school district shall 452 use the contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs 453 in providing services to the school district's students that 454 assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional 455 well-being of the students. The services provided may include 456 bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 457 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 458 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 459 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school 460 district superintendent or, in the school district 461 superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 462

appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 463 organizations that the school district hires to provide those 464 services. The school district also may use the contributions it 465 receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 466 district to receive training in providing such services to the 467 students of the school district. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.90 of the Revised Code to the nationwide children's hospital foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar483receives pursuant to section 4503.901 of the Revised Code to the484Ohio association for pupil transportation, which shall use the485money to support transportation programs, provide training to486school transportation professionals, and support other487initiatives for school transportation safety.488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar489receives pursuant to section 4503.902 of the Revised Code to St.490Ignatius high school located in the municipal corporation of491Cleveland. The school shall use fifty per cent of the492

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contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 493 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 494 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 495 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 496 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 497 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 498 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 499 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 500 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 501 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 502 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 503 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 504 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 505 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 506 services. The services 518 provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 519 defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 520 counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 521 violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 522 The school district superintendent or, in the school district 523

superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 524 appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 525 organizations that the school district hires to provide those 526 services. The school district also may use the contributions it 527 receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 528 district to receive training in providing such services to the 529 students of the school district. The school district shall 530 ensure that any charitable organization that is hired by the 531 district is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 532 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school district 533 shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 534 purpose. 535

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 536 receives pursuant to section 4503.904 of the Revised Code to the 537 Chagrin Falls exempted village school district. The school 538 district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the 539 expenses it incurs in providing services to the school 540 district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the 541 mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services 542 provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 543 defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 544 counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 545 violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 546 The school district superintendent or, in the school district 547 superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 548 appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 549 organizations that the school district hires to provide those 550 services. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar560receives pursuant to section 4503.905 of the Revised Code to the561Hudson city school district. The school district shall not use562the contributions it receives for any political purpose.563

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 564 pursuant to section 4503.92 of the Revised Code to support our 565 troops, incorporated, a national nonprofit corporation, which 566 shall use those contributions in accordance with its articles of 567 incorporation and for the benefit of servicemembers of the armed 568 forces of the United States and their families when they are in 569 financial need. 570

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 571 receives pursuant to section 4503.94 of the Revised Code to the 572 Michelle's leading star foundation, which shall use the money 573 solely to fund the rental, lease, or purchase of the simulated 574 driving curriculum of the Michelle's leading star foundation by 575 boards of education of city, exempted village, local, and joint 576 vocational school districts. 577

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 578 receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 579 friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 580 to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 581 emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 582

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 584 Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 585 activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 586 city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 587

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 588 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 589 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 590 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 591 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 592 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 593 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 594 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 595

Sec. 4503.905. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 596 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, 597 motorcycle, cab-enclosed motorcycle, or other vehicle of a class 598 approved by the registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the 599 registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of 600 "Hudson City Schools" license plates. An application made under 601 this section may be combined with a request for a special 602 reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 603 Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 604 compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 605 section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 606 appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Hudson City 607 Schools" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 608 validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 609 the Revised Code. 610

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily611inscribed on the license plates, "Hudson City Schools" license612plates shall be inscribed with words and markings selected and613

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designed by the Hudson city school district that are approved by	614
the registrar. "Hudson City Schools" license plates shall	615
display county identification stickers that identify the county	616
of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised	617
Code.	618
(B) "Hudson City Schools" license plates and a validation	619
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon	620
