A BILL

To require the Ohio History Connection to designate 1
John Glenn's childhood home as a state historic 2
site. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. In recognition of the life of John Hershel 4
Glenn, Jr., Ohio native, decorated marine corps aviator, 5
astronaut, and United States Senator, the Ohio History 6
Connection shall designate the site of John Glenn's childhood 7
home as a state historic site. The designation shall identify 72 8
West Main Street, New Concord, as the John and Annie Glenn 9
Historic Site. The Ohio History Connection shall mark the site, 10
or cause the site to be marked, in accordance with the marking 11
system established for designated historic sites within the 12
state. 13
